FEBRUARY
BLACK HISTORY MONTH



DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

FAST AND ABSTINENCE: The Sacred Season of Lent will begin in 10 days, on February 14th. Yes, it is also Valentine's Day. I suppose that there are those who struggle with this coincidence but there you have it. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (one full meal and two smaller meals which together do not equal a full meal) and abstinence (not eating meat). Each year I hear senior citizens, those over 65, tell me that they are no longer required to abstain from meat since they reached 65. This is simply not true. Everyone who reached their 14th birthday is required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. The requirement to fast ceases once one has reached his or her 60th birthday.

SPIRITUAL PROGRAMS DURING LENT (AND BEYOND):

ALPHA: We will be offering our Alpha Program, once again, during Lent and part of the Easter Season. Alpha is a wonderful opportunity to explore what we believe about Jesus and the Church, in the context of an open environment of others exploring what they believe as well. We start by sharing a simple meal, we watch a short episode of Alpha and then have the opportunity to share our thoughts and reflections about what we just viewed. This is all done in the context of small groups who respectfully listen and share with each other.

SCRIPTURE SHARING:

TUESDAY AFTERNOON: On Tuesday, February 20th, I will be restarting the Scripture Sharing Group that meets in the afternoon from 1:30 – 3:00 PM in the Adult Faith Formation Room. Each week we will view a talk by Dr. Brant Petri who reflects on the Gospel for the coming weekend. After the film we will share our thoughts about the Gospel and have opportunities to learn from each other.

TUESDAY EVENING: Presently there is a Scripture sharing group that meets Tuesday evenings at 7:00 PM in the parish center, led by Chris Chalmers and Dcn. Chris. They look ahead to the Sunday readings in preparation for participating at Mass on the upcoming weekend.

THE ASCENSION LENTEN COMPANION: WALKING WITH JESUS TO

JERUSALEM: I hope that you will join me for 8 weeks **starting Monday, February 12th**. *Walking With Jesus to Jerusalem will take place each Monday during Lent in the Adult Faith Formation Room from 1:30 – 3:00 or 3:30.* "Through daily reflections, guided prayers, journal prompts, and original artwork, the *Lenten Companion* invites you to a transformational encounter with the person of Jesus Christ and his unwavering love for his bride, the church." Together with powerful videos by Fr. Mark Toups, you will have the opportunity to experience Lent in a whole new way. Companion books will be given out to the participants.

Let us pray for each other that we will participate in one or more of the above offerings so that we can enter as fully as possible into the coming Lenten Season.

February 4, 2024

First Reading:

I am filled with restlessness until the dawn. (Jb 7:4)

Psalm:

Second Reading:

If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! (1 Cor 9:16)

Gospel:

He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons. (Mk 1:34)

Gospel Meditation

Maybe I'm weird, but I like spending time in doctor's offices, confession lines in churches, auto repair shops, prison cells, and support groups of various kinds. It's refreshing to be with people who humbly admit something is wrong and forthrightly set out on a path toward a solution. When we ignore what is off kilter, we become alone and fragile. In places where people are honest and hopeful about brokenness, sturdy if subtle fellowship usually ensues.

Consider the image we see of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. **"...they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by a demon. The whole town was gathered at the door."** The entire human community is afflicted in various ways, and so it gradually forms a strange new community around Jesus. The healer from Nazareth is like a sun of health around which orbits a throng of humanity absorbing his healing rays. These blessed souls can't fix themselves and become healthy, and they know it. But they have found in him the living source of all imaginable healing.

It's the Church, isn't it? A sin-sick community gathered and healed is what happens at the beginning of every Mass. We shuffle in through the door from everywhere and announce that we are not okay, and we can't fix it. In doing so, we are drawn into the orbit of the healing power of Christ — and into a renewed community with the whole human family. It's nothing to fear or rush. Maybe we can even learn to enjoy more how good it is to be in such a happy place.

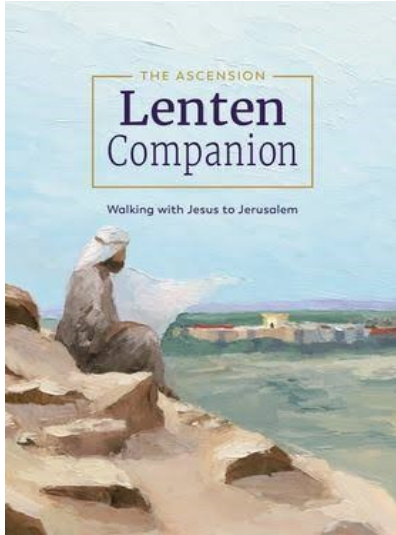

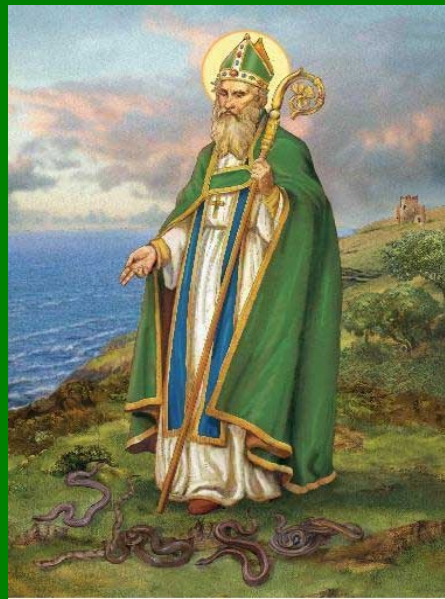

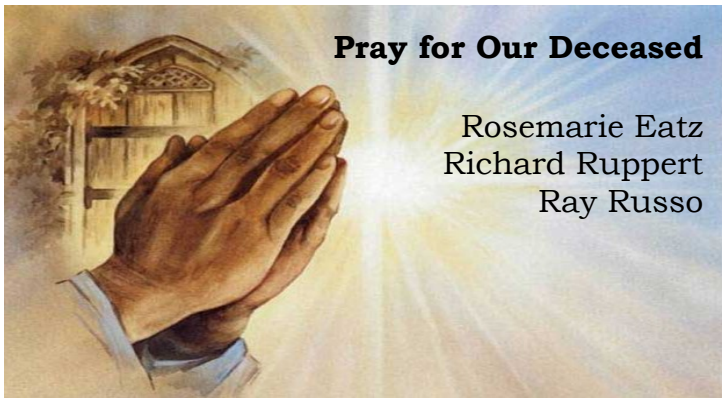
