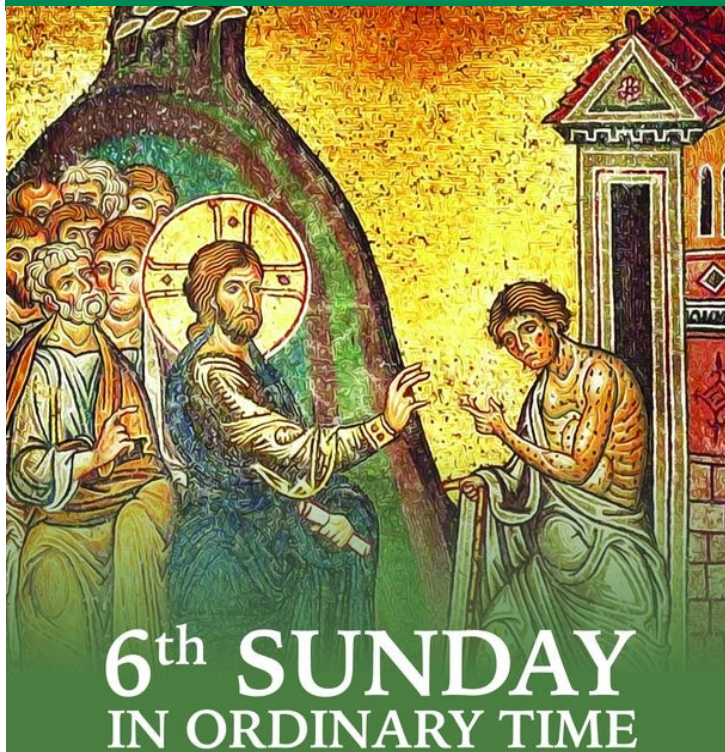

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

“Will this be just another Lent to endure (or ignore), or will this Lent be the one that transforms your life?”

Lent is about making choices. Only you and I can decide if this is going to be “just another Lent” or if this Lent is going to be an opportunity for us to “*root out all that is not yet Christ in us*” and to become more deeply engaged in the life of the Church.

Our choice to accept the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday is an important one. The mark of ashes is our “yes” to enter the discipline of Lent through prayer, fasting, acts of charity and greater care for the poor (almsgiving). These penitential acts are meant to realign our lives so that we make a “return to the Lord” and show a greater loyalty to the Gospel.

Fr. Mark Toup, a parish priest and spiritual guide, says simply, “*If you always do what you’ve always done, you’ll always get what you’ve always got.*”

Do something different this Lent. We are offering two special spiritual programs to assist you in the work of Lent. One is the Alpha program, which gives all the participants an opportunity to grow spiritually within a safe environment, while building a stronger sense of community.

Our second offering will be a Parish Lenten Mission, each Monday during Lent, starting on Monday February 27th, from 7:30 – 8:30 PM. These talks will be given within the context of a Holy Hour, and will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The word repent is a call to return to the Lord with all our hearts. Maybe, you and I don’t think of ourselves as having moved away from God. After all, we see ourselves as good people. Is Pope Francis a “good person?” Yet when he was interviewed by Antonio Spadaro, for America Magazine, the Pope’s simple response to say something about himself was, “*I am a sinner.*” Only when you and I believe the same about ourselves will we be able to respond to the call to repentance, the essential work of Lent. Yes, even “good people” sin and in need of repentance.

The call to “believe in the Gospel” is not simply to accept certain truths. To believe in the Gospel is to be “loyal” to Jesus and his teachings. All of our decisions, in every aspect of our lives, must flow from what we believe. That’s how true believers behave.

So what will it be? The choice is ours to make. Don’t make this just another Lent to endure! Make this Lent a time of personal spiritual growth and transformation. Each Sunday our homilies will help guide you in this resolve. Then, after the work of Lent is done, we will be ready to renew our commitment to Christ through the renewal of our baptismal promises at Easter.

WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 11, 2024

First Reading:

"As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean.

He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." (Lv 13:8)

Gospel Meditation

Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. (Please don't tell anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

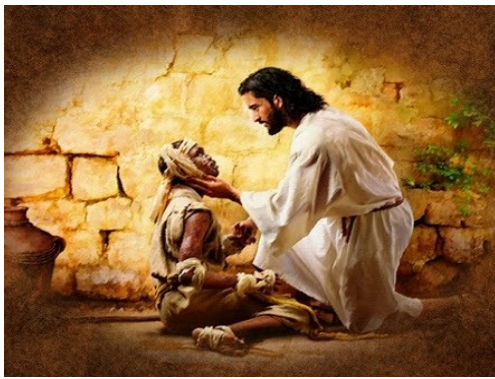
This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, "**If you will it, you can make me clean.**" At this, just before the healing, Jesus was "**moved with compassion.**" The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it *feels like* to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will *feel what we are feeling*, and thereby heal us.

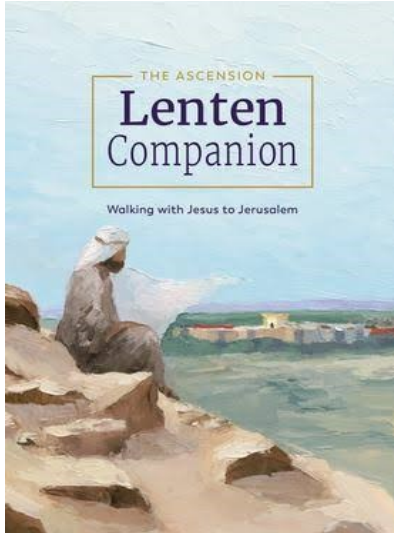
March 20: Readiness to Renew Our Baptismal Promises

St. Bernard Parish - Bereavement Support Group - Spring 2024

St. Bernard's Parish Social Ministry will be offering in-person bereavement support groups this spring. Two support groups are being offered:

Beginning on Saturday, April 6th and continuing through June 1st there will be a weekly support group for the newly bereaved. This program is designed to help the newly bereaved learn about the grief process, develop skills to learn to cope with their grief and to begin adjusting to living in a world without the deceased. This group is facilitated by Dr. Lou Sabatini and will meet in the parish center from 11:00am to 12:15pm. This group will consist of those who have lost a spouse/partner, sibling, parent or other relative. It is a closed group that meets for nine weeks.

Beginning on Monday, March 18th and meeting on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month there is an ongoing group for bereaved parents. The group will meet in the parish center from 7:00pm to 8:15pm. The facilitators are bereaved parents who have been trained by Dr. Sabbatini and have been leading the group for several years. The group aims to help parents develop coping skills and how to move forward after such a devastating loss.

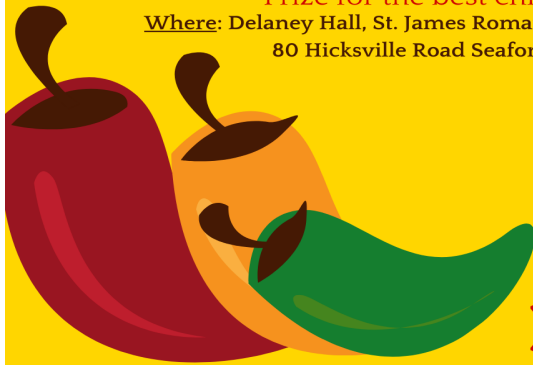

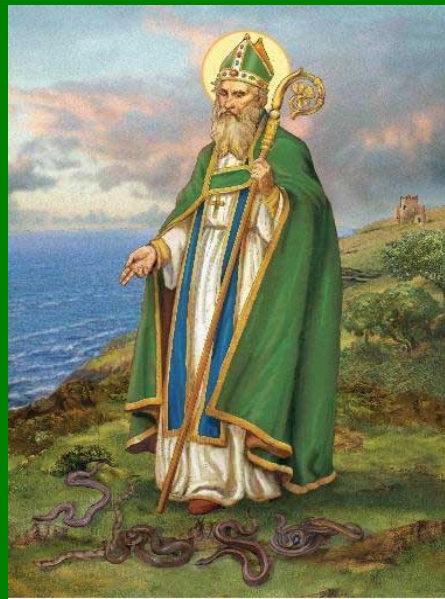

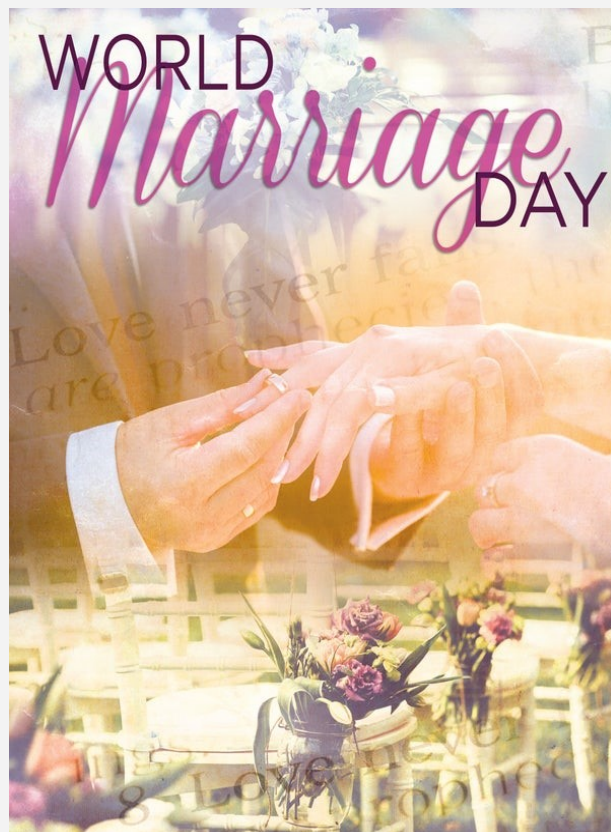
