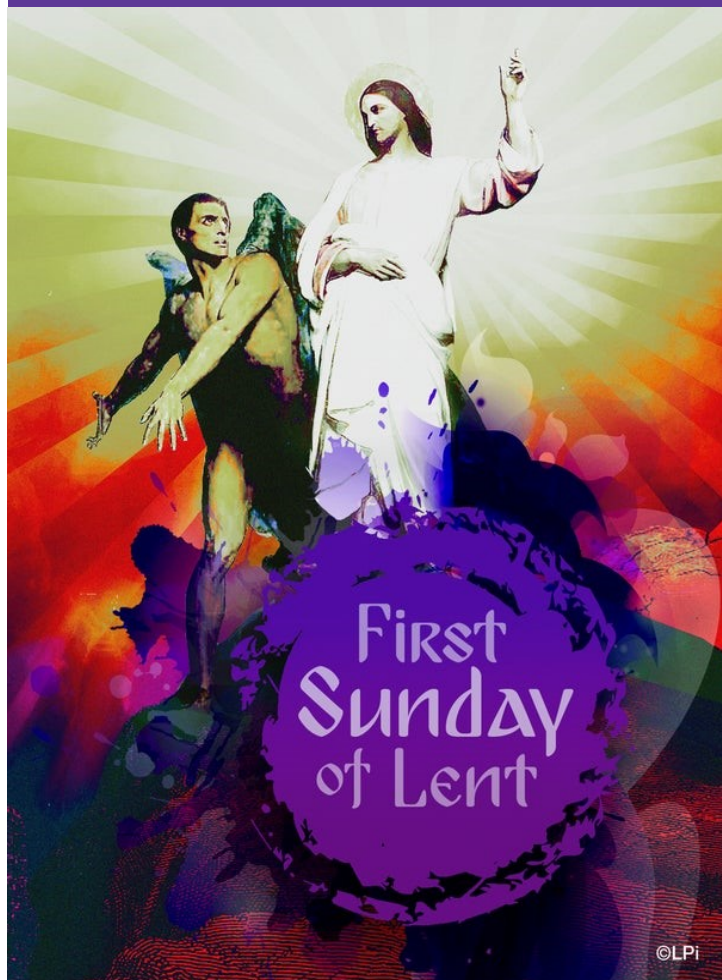

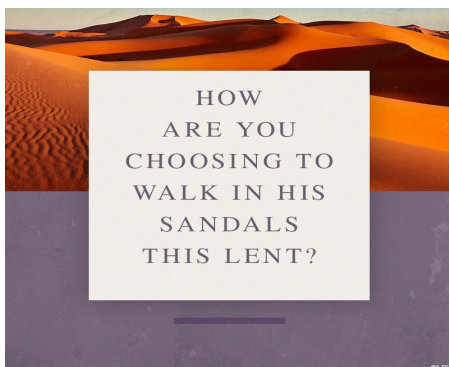

Dear Brothers and Sisters and Christ,

A while back I came upon this pithy quote, *"God cannot steer a parked car."* It reminds me of the daily challenge that we face as Catholic disciples of Jesus but especially during this Sacred Season of Lent. It is not unusual that we fall into a regular routine of behavior, good or bad, and remain there unless we make the decision to act in a different manner. While this is harmless in many instances, in others, the behavior we have fallen into is not a healthy one. Lent is our annual "wake up call" to put things right in our relationship with God and each other.

The challenge we face is meant to be life giving by acting as a corrective to what is presently going in in our lives. Consider the following:

"Broadly speaking, we have two tendencies to overcome this Lent. On the one hand, we need to get off our butts and live as we ought to live. We need to remember that we belong to Christ! "No soldier on service gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to satisfy the one who enlisted him" (2 Timothy 2:4). We need to put away our desires for a life of ease and comfort and prepare ourselves for the task that is given us. There's no avoiding it: the only options are to train for the battle and fight or to be taken and destroyed by the enemy. A good friend always says, "We don't want to be found playing beach volleyball on the sands of Normandy on D-Day." (Jeff Windy, Daily Lenten Reflection, 2/22/21)."

The battle we are thrust into is an age old one, the battle between good and evil, between living a life reflective of our relationship with God or falling into the lure of the evil one. Today, Satan is hiding in clear sight. While there are many positive things that can be said about our culture, there are opposing values to the Gospel that have found acceptance by many, including people of faith. Some examples include, the disregard by some of the Biblical mandate to care for the stranger and alien among us, the on-going scandal of racism in all its forms, the utter disregard for the sanctity of human life from the first moment of conception to one's natural death and our negligence in the care of the planet in which we live, Mother Earth.

Yes, "God cannot steer a parked car." Lent is about getting out of our present spiritual parking space in order to embark on the active road to reconciliation and healing through personal repentance and change in our lives. What do you need to change this Lent?

To assist you we are offering a number of opportunities to address this challenge: our Parish Lenten Mission, *Alpha*, Scripture Study opportunities, *Walking With Jesus to Jerusalem*. If you have chosen to observe Lent in a casual way in the past, you are going to get similar results. I invite you to. . . **Enter Lent. . . "Repent and Believe."** for **"The Kingdom of God is at hand."**

WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

First Sunday of Lent

February 18, 2024

First Reading:

God said to Noah and to his sons with him:

"See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you." (Gn 9:8-10)

Psalm:

Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant. (Ps 25)

Second Reading:

It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. (1 Pt 3:21)

Gospel:

He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. (Mk 1:13)

Gospel Meditation

When I feel down, I sometimes watch the famous "Double Rainbow" video on YouTube to feel better. It's hilarious. A young man camping in Yosemite Park sees two rainbows stretching across the sky. He bursts into a kind of ecstasy. "Double rainbow, all the way! Oh my God!" he announces. Then he starts to weep. He cries out, "What does it *mean*?" Beneath the humor of his glorious overreaction is the deep intuition we all have, I think, when we see the colorful bow in the sky. This Sunday, God sends a rainbow to Noah, and to us. What *does* it mean?

Long before YouTube had the double rainbow, Dante's medieval poem *The Divine Comedy* featured one in his image of paradise. Seeing two rainbows, he muses that one is born of the other. The bow is God's promise of peace. For Dante, it's even more: nature's encrypted image of the Trinitarian God. One visible rainbow (God the Son) is begotten of another usually invisible one (God the Father) united by invisible light between them (God the Spirit). Like invisible light, Trinitarian glory surrounds us in every moment — but Jesus has made it visible in his glorious body.

Lenten challenge: This might seem silly, but this Lent I invite you to find a rainbow and meditate on it. You might have to make one yourself, like this current desert-dweller will. Gaze on it. See there a natural gift from the Creator, saying to you, "Here I am! I will love and protect you, surrounding you in My glory." This Lent let's embrace that with confidence, rain, or shine.

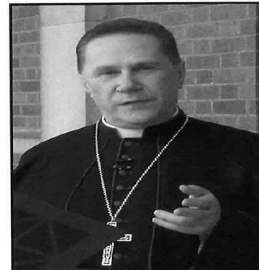

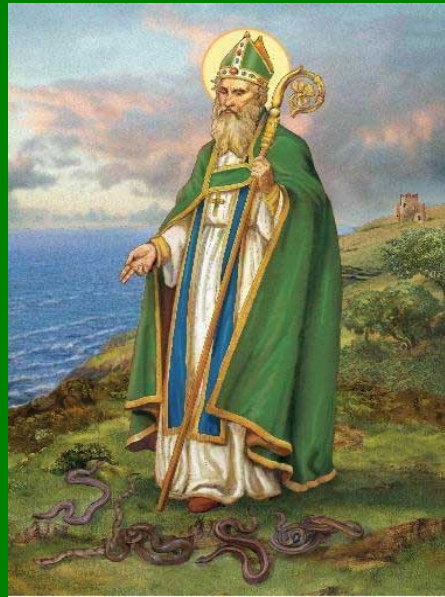

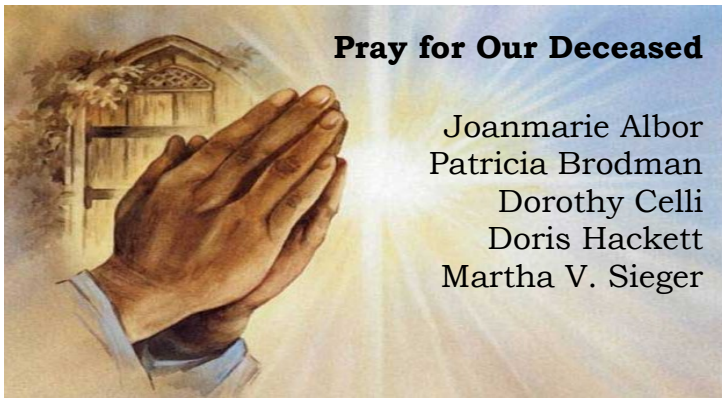
February 18 - First Sunday of Lent:

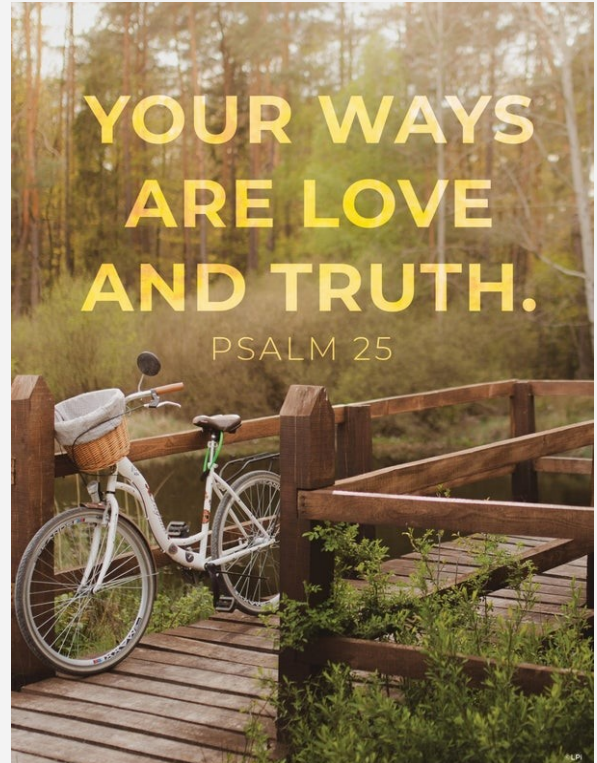
