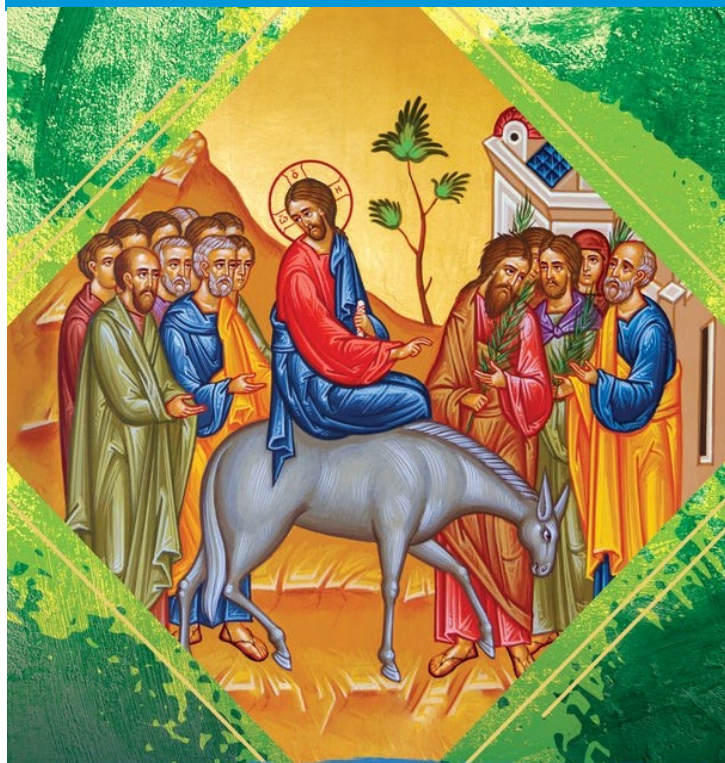

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

PALM SUNDAY: This weekend is Palm Sunday Weekend. We remember the triumphal entry into Jerusalem by Jesus. He was greeted by the masses as they shouted, *"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosannah to the Son of David!"* Jesus entered Jerusalem in order to complete his work as the Savior by undergoing his passion and death on the cross. You might recall that there were several times listed in the Gospels when the Jewish leaders wanted to arrest him and put him to death. He alone was to determine when that would happen and not the Jewish leaders nor the Romans. It was to happen according to God's plan.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM: This week we enter the most Sacred Week of the Liturgical Year, which the church calls Holy Week. During Lent we participated in the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, abstaining from meat on Fridays, almsgiving (reaching out and supporting the poor) works of charity or participating in a Lenten Program like our Lenten Parish Mission, *Journey with Jesus to Jerusalem*, or one of our Scripture Study Programs. We are now prepared to celebrate the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus to New Life.

CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION): The most appropriate way to prepare for the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter) is by celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. By going to confession, we acknowledge that we have reviewed our life during Lent and have identified areas where we have not kept God's commandments or are living outside the church's teachings.

Some examples to consider requiring our need to go to confession before receiving Holy Communion:

- 1) I've returned to the church after a long absence. I need to be reconciled with the church by going to confession before receiving Holy Communion.
- 2) I do not take seriously the obligation to attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. I need to be reconciled with the church by going to confession before receiving Holy Communion.
- 3) I am involved in a lifestyle that is considered contrary to the moral teachings of the Church (same-sex unions, living together outside of marriage in the church, having sexual relations outside of marriage). I need to be reconciled with the church by beginning to live according to the moral teachings of the church before going to confession and receiving Holy Communion.
- 4) I am divorced and remarried outside the church. I need to be reconciled with the church by seeking an annulment and celebrating my marriage in the church before I can go to confession and receive Holy Communion.

The requirement to go to confession before receiving Holy Communion in the cases listed above are not seen as a means of punishing sinners or treating them as outcasts but as a form of bringing them reconciliation and healing with the Church before they might receive Holy Communion.

There are many opportunities to do this during the coming week. Please consult Page 6 for the complete schedule of when confessions are being heard.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

March 24, 2024

First Reading:

I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. (Is 50:7)

Psalm:

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? (Ps 22)

Second Reading:

He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him. (Phil 2:8-9)

Gospel:

They brought him to the place of Golgotha—which is translated Place of the Skull—. (Mk 15:22)

Gospel Meditation

A few months before they married, my twenty-three-year-old sister and her fiancé planned a cross-country road trip to visit his family. My parents told them that they could only go if they slept in separate hotel rooms, offering to foot the bill. It might sound prudish, but my parents wanted the young couple to understand that their approaching unity was close, but not yet. Patience solidifies love.

What could this possibly have to do with Palm Sunday? It's usually overlooked, but the Gospels tell us that, after entering Jerusalem, Jesus **"looked around ... and since it was late, went out to Bethany with the twelve"** (Mk 11:11) for the night. Who cares? Why include this detail? Jews in those days believed that the new Davidic King would one day re-enter and "marry" the city. A new future marked by fidelity would begin for God's people. Israel's God would be in union with His people forever. Without over-sexualizing the metaphor, perhaps Jesus refused to sleep in Jerusalem to remind us of his *marital* purpose. He was entering Jerusalem as the bridegroom-king. It was almost time, but not yet. Soon he will sleep in Jerusalem in the tomb and then something new will begin: his one body, his Church.

Lenten challenge: This Holy Week, I challenge you to keep this image in your mind all the way until Easter Sunday: Jesus is the faithful bridegroom who patiently prepares his bride for their new life together. Go to the Good Friday liturgy and kiss the cross. When you do, let that gesture be the long-awaited "I do" to our faithful God, who always waits for us.

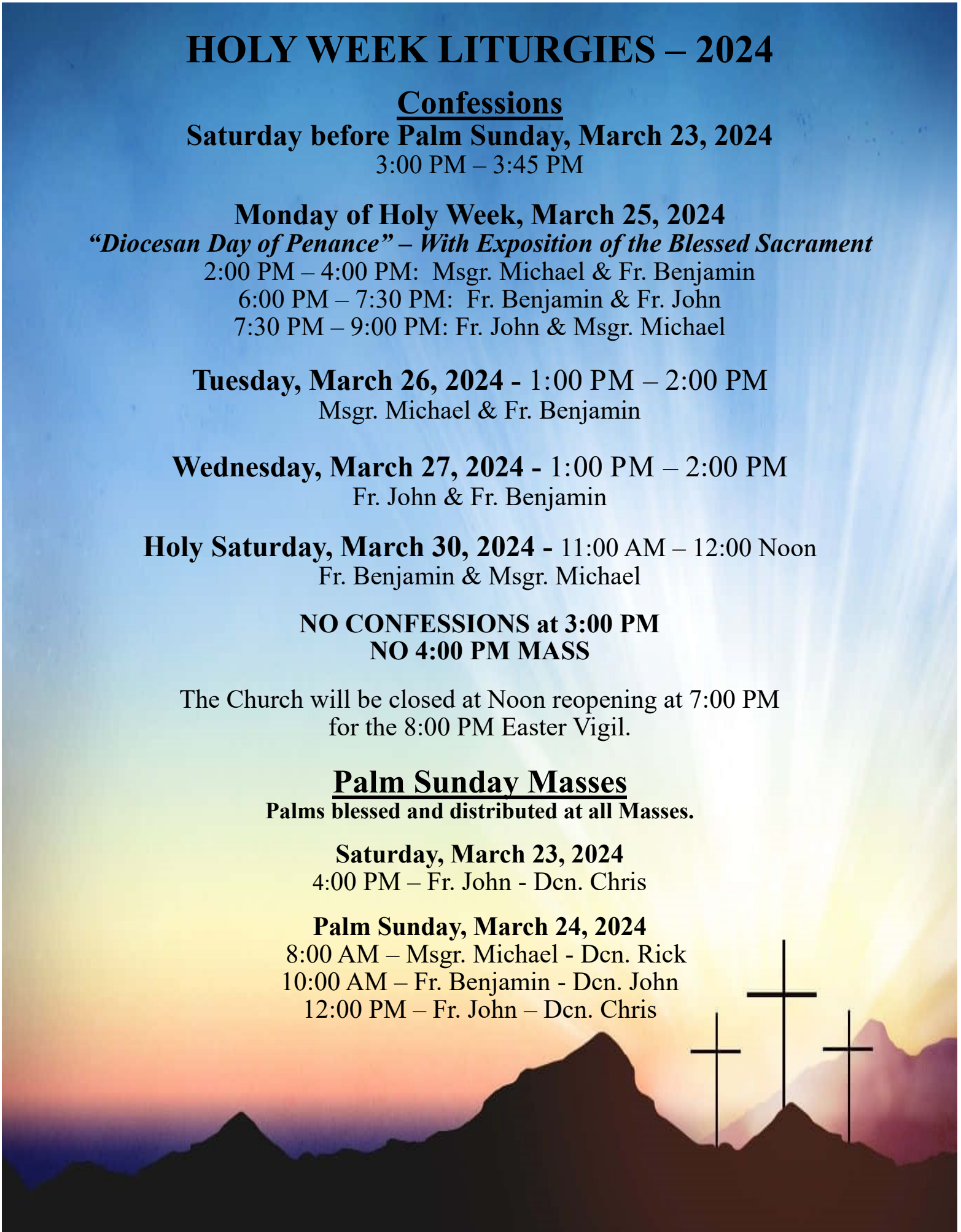

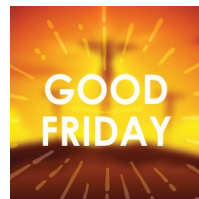

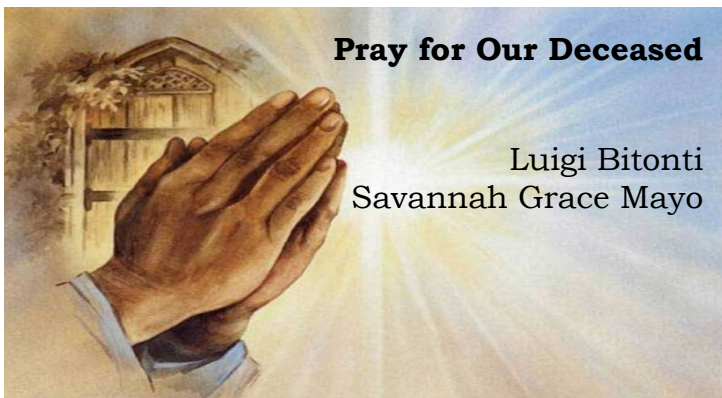
