SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

BAPTISMS:

Those wishing to be married at St. James should call the Parish Office (731-3710) to arrange an appointment with one of the parish clergy. Please allow 6 months at least for the necessary preparations. Please do not enter into any other wedding commitments prior to having your wedding date and time confirmed by the Parish.

WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

Easter Sunday

March 31, 2024

First Reading:

This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. (Acts 10:40-41)

Psalm:

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. (Ps 118) Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading:

If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. (Col 3:1) Or: Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. (1 Cor 5:7)

Gospel:

For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead. (Jn 20:9)

Gospel Meditation

Outside Chicago, there is a small cemetery in the woods behind Mundelein Seminary, where I was a student. One night I was exploring it. I looked up and was shocked to see an imposing seventeen-foot angel towering over me and preparing to blow a trumpet. Adrenaline rushed through me. I gasped and uttered, "Oh my God!" Quickly I realized it was in fact a massive bronze statue. I tried to calm myself down. But it still freaked me out.

As we begin to celebrate Easter today, this image might seem a bit unnerving. But please recall that for the first disciples on the morning of the resurrection, it was precisely that. It wasn't joyful at first, it was terrifying. It wasn't peaceful, it was unsettling. In that Jerusalem cemetery, something otherworldly had happened. Angels announced that he was no longer dead, but alive. They had blown their trumpets, so to speak, and Jesus had risen. Soon the disciples' shock in that dark cemetery would turn into joy.

We all have our own places of the dead, too, don't we? Deceased loved ones. Our tired patterns of blame. Relationships stuck in resentment. Indifference to the poor. Lost dreams. Despair about our future. Fear of sickness and death. These are our "cemeteries" where we don't expect much to happen. Today we enter — if we dare — those places with the disciples. See the mighty angel standing there, trumpet ready to blare!

Live the Liturgy - Inspiration for the week

Even as the disciples saw the empty tomb and the discarded burial cloths, they did not understand what had happened. But they kept faith, trusting that the Lord was at work. Let us keep that same faith when we do not find God where we expect Him to be.



DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

Easter Blessings to all of our Parishioners, our families and friends!

We just completed the celebrations of Holy Week: Holy Thursday (when we celebrated the Lord's Last Supper), and Good Friday (when we commemorated the Passion and Death of Jesus.) This weekend, Easter, we celebrate the Lord's Resurrection.

Our "participation" in the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus was first granted to us on the day that we were baptized. Each year, on Easter Sunday, we renew our Baptismal Promises, having made a Renunciation of Sin and the Affirmation of our Faith. We recommitted ourselves to practice our Catholic Faith as disciples of Jesus today, making Jesus known and loved by the example of our lives.

Last weekend, I shared at the Masses which I celebrated, that I had read a book a number of years ago titled, *"Not a Fan,"* by Kyle Idleman. This book had a profound impact on me as it invited me to consider, "was I a fan of Jesus or an active member of his team?"

Kyle used the image of an athletic game. This conjured up in me the image of a game being played on a basketball court, or on a baseball or football field. He mentioned that in these situations, as we sit in the stands, we are observers, simply fans of the game. The Gospel, he suggested calls us not to be "fans" but to be "participants" in the life and work of the Church.

Please consider what position that you are presently taking. When you come to Church, are you an observer (fan), a participant (player) or perhaps neither? The Renewal of your baptismal promises is a direct call to become more active in the practice of your faith.

Being an active participant means singing of the responsorial psalm and hymns, in the spoken prayers and observing the gestures (standing, sitting or kneeling), each of which has a particular meaning. It is not sufficient to simply be present in the Church. The Mass call us to *"full, active and conscious participation."* We are "participants" and not just "fans."

If you can honestly see yourself as an active participant, then that is wonderful. If you see yourself simply as an observer, make the decision to become more active at Mass.

May the Risen Lord call each of us to be "active" members of His Church.

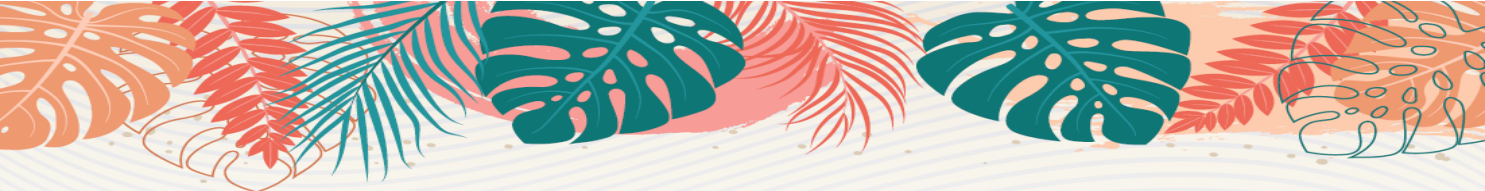

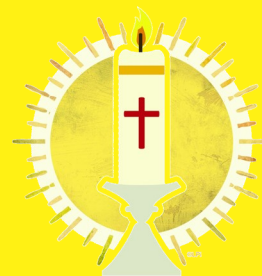

Liturgical Minister Training– Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

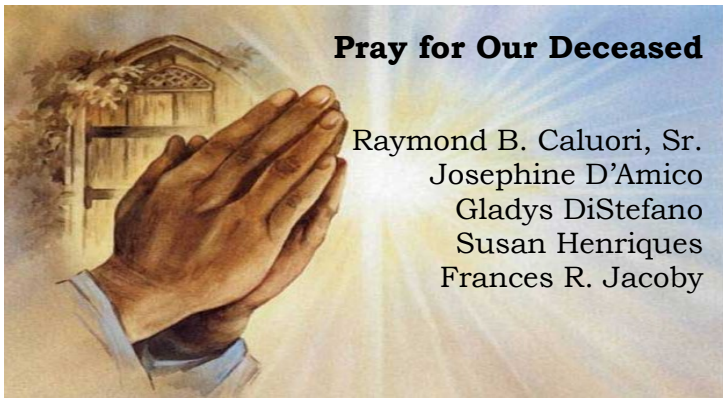
