DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

PARISH MINISTRY FAIR: In my letter last weekend I shared with you that I would give you an update on our coming Ministry Fair, which will take place on Pentecost Sunday, the weekend of May 18th & 19th. Pentecost Sunday is the ideal time to hold such a fair since we are celebrating the Gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church and the wonderful expressions of His presence in the life of the church and in each local parish community.

This coming Monday evening, April 29th, the Ministry and Organization leaders will make final preparations for this year's Ministry Fair. If you remember we held one last year after each of the weekend Masses. This gave you the opportunity to visit our Ministry Fair tent to view the various displays prepared by each of our parish's ministry and organization leaders.

This has a twofold purpose. First to celebrate the existence of each of these groups, about 37 in all, and second to invite you to consider how you might participate in one or more of these ministries or organizations.

Recall, the that during the Season of Lent, through acts of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we prepared for the renewal of our baptismal promises. This renewal is our personal participation in the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. The main purpose of the Easter Season is to deepen our understanding of what it means to be a baptized member of the body of Christ and to discern how we can live out that understanding in a concrete way. What might the Lord be calling you to do as an expression of your Baptism? That's a significant question that we should all be asking ourselves.

My hope is that in our Pentecost celebration of the release of the Holy Spirit on the Church, we will discover what gift(s) we might have been given to join with others in the concrete expression of our Baptism.

In the meantime, I hope that the reading and the homilies given by our priests and deacons will prepare you for Pentecost Sunday. Let's pray for each other and our parish community as we travel towards Pentecost.

FIRST COMMUNION CELEBRATIONS: This weekend we celebrated the second of our First Communion Masses. The children were so excited as they finally were able to receive Jesus in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. How wonderful they all looked in their First Communion dresses and suits.

These celebrations for our parish children always remind me of the description of the responsibility of parents to their children. In the first Catechetical Directory a parent was taking on the role *"to be the primary educators of the children in the ways of our faith."* The latest Catechetical Directory changed this to read that parents are called *"to be the primary witnesses to their children in the ways of our faith."*

You see primary educators is about passing on information while being the primary witnesses is focused on being examples of Christian life. It is my hope that all parents understand and accept this serious obligation for the good of their children and the Church.

I will write more about our First Communions in a future bulletin.

First Reading:

Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him. (Acts 9:27)

Gospel Meditation

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would never prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of his Father, "**He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit**" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not his work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing.

The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand-new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry branches to the one who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.

The St. Agnes Music Department will continue the tradition of presenting great sacred classical music masterworks with the performance of these two gems, composed for choir, orchestra, and soloists. Vivaldi's setting of the Gloria takes on the form of an extended cantata, where the various parts of the text are given a separate movement. Vivaldi composed this setting of the Gloria text when working at the famous orphanage turned music school: the Ospedale della Pietà in Venice, Italy.

Bach's setting of the Magnificat takes a similar format of dividing up the texts for the purposes of creating individual movements. Bach was newly appointed to the St. Thomas Church (Thomaskirche), Leipzig, Germany, when the 1st performance took place in 1723, 300 years ago this past year! The orchestration is a delight to hear, as are the choral and vocal solo parts. The challenging Baroque music is further decorated by the use of five-part singing of the Choir (SSATB)!

Remembrance envelopes are mailed and are available in the narthex of the church.

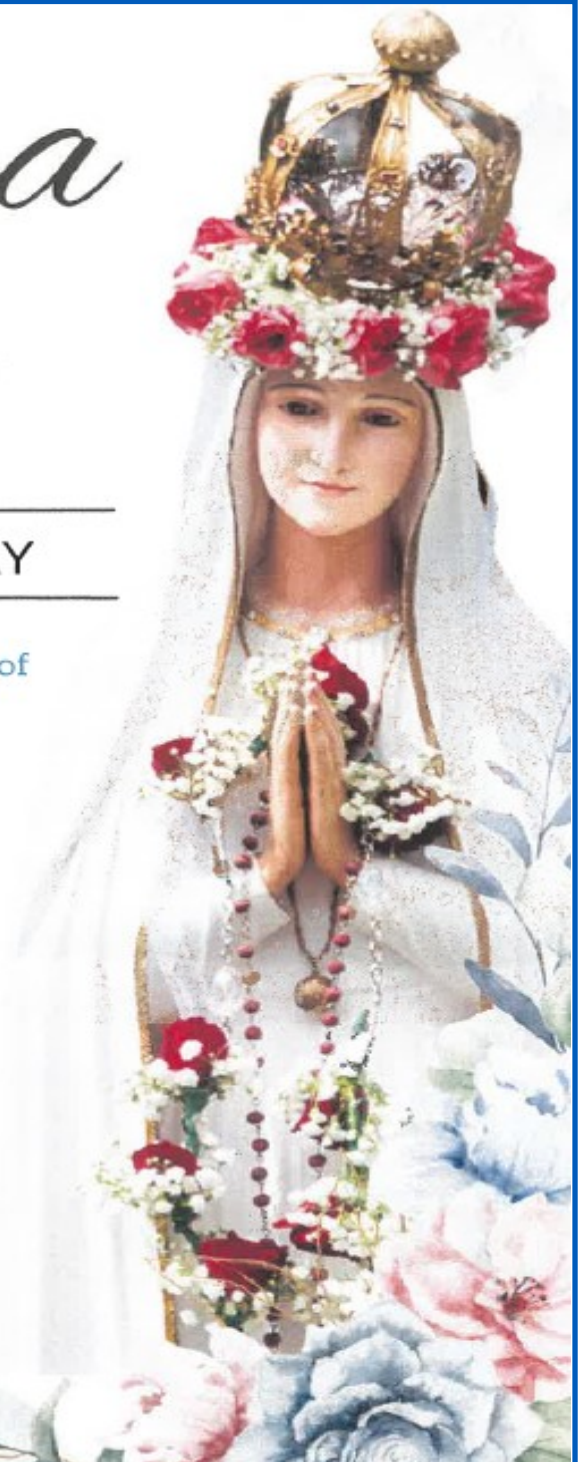

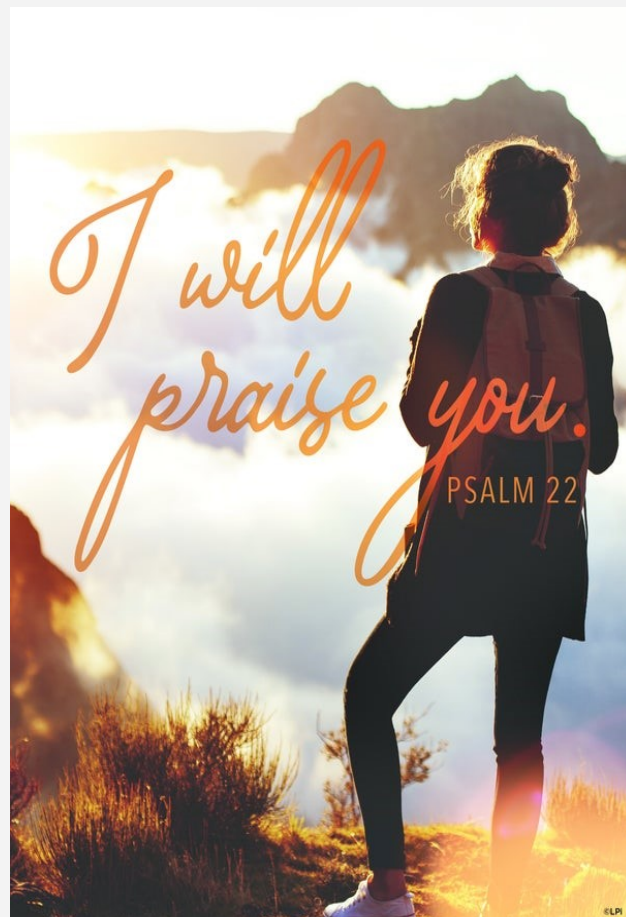
