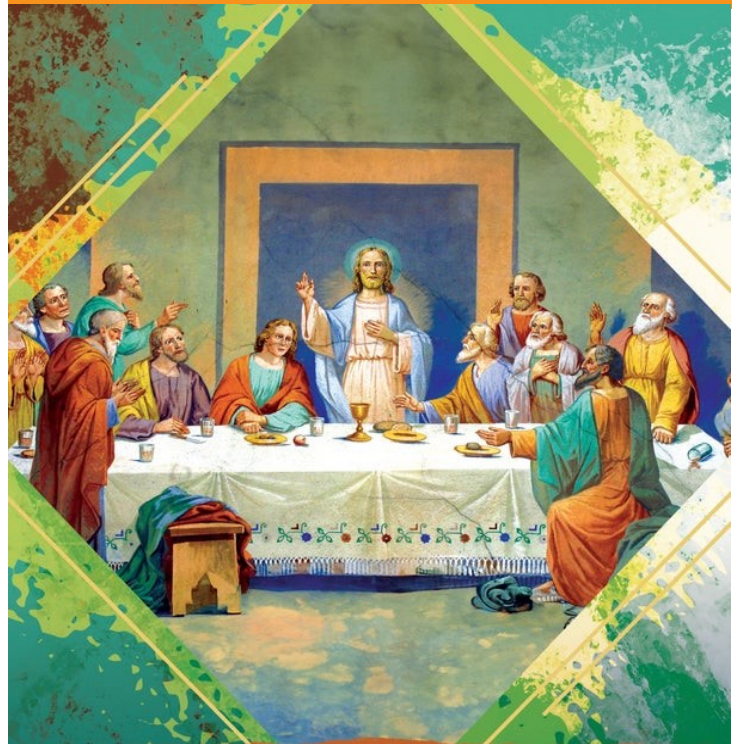

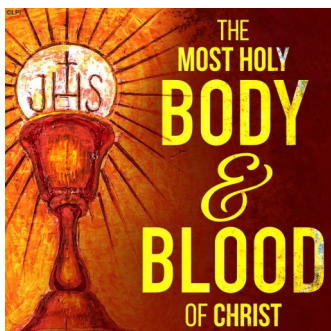

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST:

This weekend we have the privilege to celebrate our faith conviction that when we are receiving Holy Communion we are, in fact, receiving the true Body and Blood of Jesus under that sacramental appearance of bread and wine. Have you ever considered that our belief in the True Presence is that greatest expression that we believe the Jesus is truly risen from the grave? For, if Jesus has not been raised from death to life then the bread and wine are not transformed into His Body and Blood.

What were you taught about Holy Communion? What do you personally believe about what is it that you are receiving? Do you believe that it is simply a sign or symbol of His Body and Blood? The teachings and beliefs of the Catholic Church are that through the power of the Holy Spirit and the words of the priest, acting in the "person of Jesus Christ," this ordinary bread and wine are transformed into Jesus' Body and Blood.

DO YOU RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION RESPECTFULLY?

I have written about this in the past, but it is important to restate these questions as they are for your spiritual benefit, while respecting the sacredness of the Eucharist. What should prevent you from receiving Holy Communion? Are you married in a manner that is not recognized by the Catholic Church? Is this a second or third marriage, which has taken place without first having received an annulment from your original marriage? Are you living a lifestyle contrary to the moral teachings of the Church? Do you have same sex attractions and active in that lifestyle? Are you married, or even single, and involved sexually with a single or married person?

Are you a baptized member of the Catholic Church? The reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics as it is also a sign of our union with the Catholic Church. Are you a Catholic but do not go to Mass each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation? Missing Mass, without a valid reason is a grave sin and a Catholic must go to Confession before receiving Holy Communion.

The Church isn't depriving you of receiving Holy Communion as a form of "punishment." The very opposite is true. It is therapeutic. The Church is asking you not to receive Holy Communion until you have recognized that you are not living in "communion" with the Church and that you will do what you must to change your situation.

THE DEATH OF MSGR. DANIEL PICCIANO, FR. DAN:

Last Sunday we received word that Fr. Dan Picciano, the 6th pastor of St. James passed away. This past Thursday afternoon his wake was held in our church. That evening we celebrated a Mass of Transferral. This past Friday, his funeral Mass was celebrated. Msgr. Dan honored us by requesting that his funeral be celebrated at St. James.

I mention Fr. Dan's death not only to spread this sad news but to hold him up as an excellent example of a priest who understood his responsibility to live the meaning of the Eucharist, which called him to foster a parish church of faith and friendship. Certainly, Fr. Dan spent the priesthood doing just that, forming St. James Parish into that type of faith community.

Thank you, Fr. Dan! We are continuing the work that you began when you served here as our pastor. May you rest in peace! Please pray for us as we pray for you!

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 2, 2024

First Reading:

"This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words of his." (Ex 24:8)

Psalm:

I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord. (Ps 116) Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading:

How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. (Heb 9:14)

Gospel:

"Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." (Mk 14:22-24)

Gospel Meditation

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.

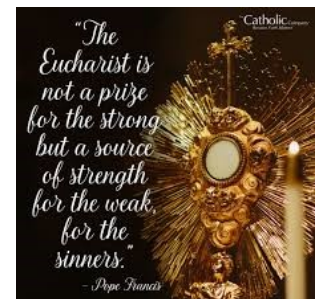

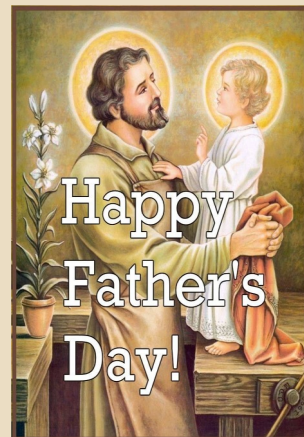

Question: What are the "fruits" of holy Communion?

Q & A

Answer: The Eucharist is the center of our spiritual life and has enormous effects on our growth, our holiness, and our way of life. The fruits of holy Communion are the benefits one receives from the sacrament. These fruits of holy Communion are discussed in the catechism in the article on the Eucharist. The primary benefit is union with Christ. We become one with him sacramentally, just as we hope to become one with him for eternity. The Eucharist also separates us from sin, both past and future. It forgives the venial sins of the past and, by the love we receive, protects us from mortal sin in the future. The church community is also unified and strengthened by the Eucharist. It unites us to the poor and offers the pledge of eternal life.
