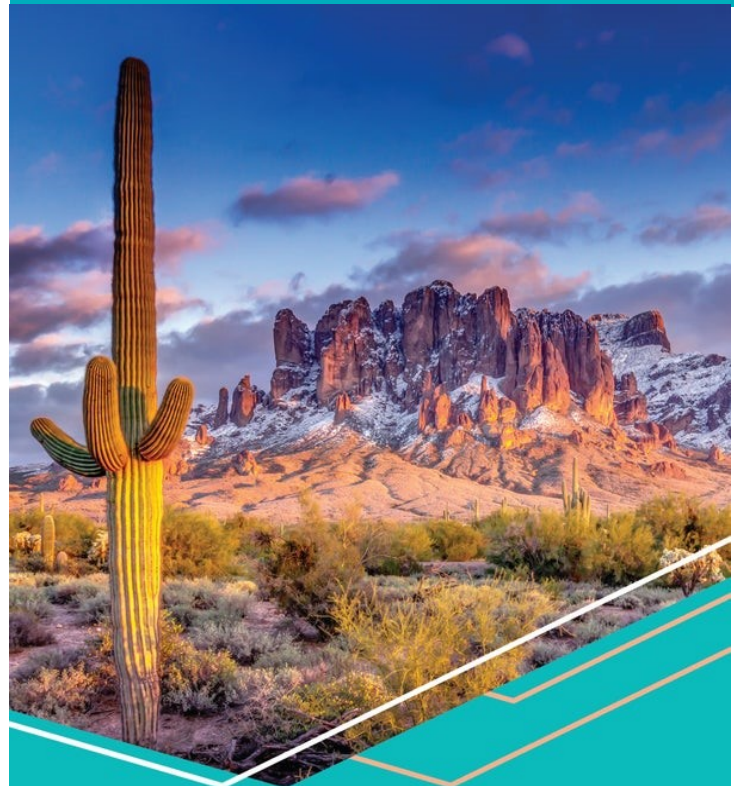

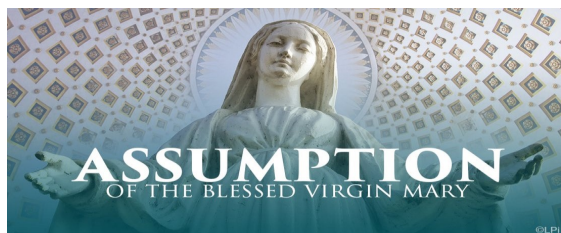

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY INTO HEAVEN:

This week the Church will celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. It is the Catholic Church's belief that at the end of her earthly life Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was preserved from physical death and brought, Body and Soul into Heaven. It is one of the special graces that Mary received from her Son, Jesus.

From the website of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception we can read:

"Because of Mary's participation in the Incarnation of Christ, she was honored as a unique member of the Church. Just as Solomon brought the Ark of the Covenant to the Temple (1 Kings 8:17-21), Mary, as the Ark of the New Covenant, was brought to heaven to dwell where Christ is.

*The west tympana of the Great Upper Church tell of significant events in the history of Marian doctrine, including the definition of the dogma of the Assumption in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. Though the Assumption of Mary is not documented in the New Testament, it is expounded in **Section 966** of the Catechism of the Catholic Church:*

Finally, the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians: In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death."

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THIS SOLEMNITY TO US:

As we celebrate this Solemnity it is important that we consider its significance to us. Mary's Assumption into Heaven is the anticipation of the great gift that will be given to us at the end of time, when all of us will be joined together with the Lord Jesus and His Most Blessed Mother into Heaven.

Recall that in our Creed we state that, "...we believe in the Resurrection of the Body and life everlasting." I have stated on occasion that it is my sincere hope that my resurrected body will be at least sixty pounds lighter than this one.

A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION:

Due to the significance and sacredness of this Feast the Church requires all Catholics to participate in Mass. The Mass schedule for this Solemnity is: Wednesday, August 14th at 4:00 PM and Thursday, August 15th at 8:00 AM, 12:00 Noon and 7:30 PM.

Please join us for one of these Eucharistic Celebrations as together we give honor to the Blessed Mother, the Mother of the Church, marking the occasion of her Assumption into Heaven.

First Reading:

Gospel Meditation

This week we hear Jesus say, "**He that believes in me, has eternal life**" (John 6:47). These straightforward words, uttered by human lips, sound — how to put this? — insane. Who could possibly say such a thing? Jesus says things that are so high, so demanding, so beyond our capacity to fathom, we hardly know what to do with them and (if you're like me), they usually go in one ear and out the other. So, let us ask: how can believing in him lead to eternal life?

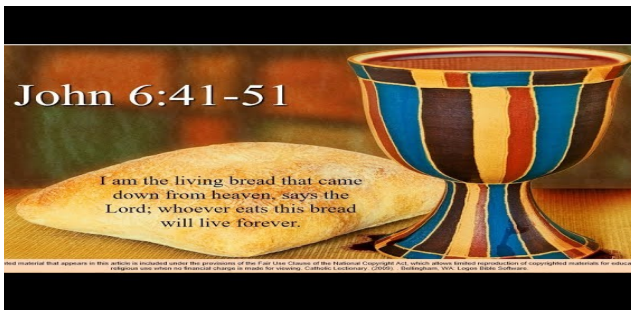
To believe in something means not just to acknowledge its existence, but also to orient yourself entirely to it. If a football player believes in his team, it means he puts his life totally at the service of that goal. If a student believes in her dream to become a doctor, she gives everything she has to her studies and preparation for her MCAT test. Belief means to move boldly toward something we love, and trust is possible to attain.

What is the highest possible good at which we can aim? It is God himself, the gift of eternal life without end. Jesus has made this "good" possible in and through his human nature. To believe in him means to have him as our ultimate goal. This week let's believe the truth of these words and make practical decisions to orient ourselves toward what we see available in him: eternal life.

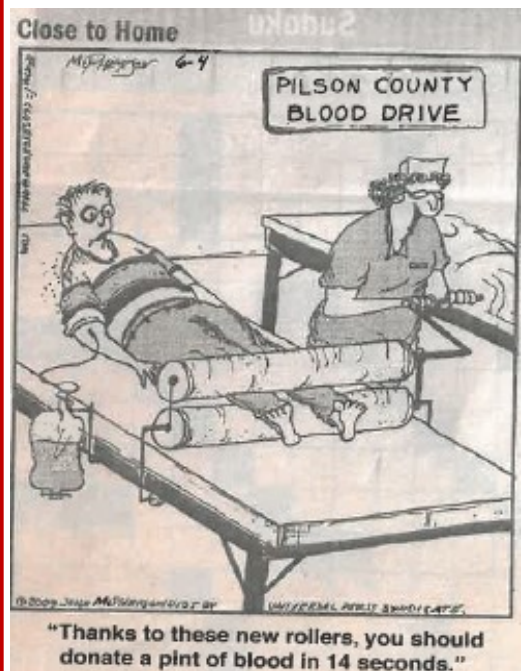

What is Alpha?

Alpha is a multi-week course that creates a space where people come and discuss life's big questions. Each talk looks at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation. Alpha runs online, in cafés, churches, universities, homes - you name it. No two Alphas look the same, but generally they have three key things in common: hospitality, a talk and good conversation.

What does an Alpha session consist of?

First, there's food

Whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table, or a quick catch up over coffee and cake, food has a way of bringing people together. It's no different at Alpha. Most sessions start with food, because it's a great way to build community and get to know each other.

Then there's a talk

The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. Usually around thirty minutes long, they may be a live talk or played as a video. They explore the big issues around faith and unpack the basics of Christianity, addressing questions from Who is Jesus? and How can we have faith? to Why and how do I pray? and How does God guide us?

Finally, a discussion

This is probably the most important part of any Alpha: the chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, and simply discuss it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say (seriously). It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment.

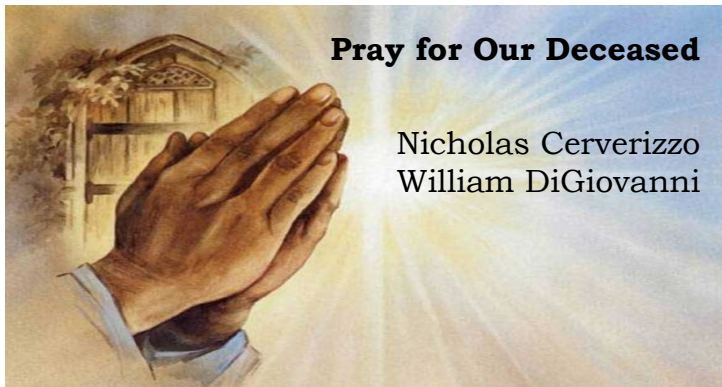
Question:

Why are Catholics required to get married in a church, and not outside or at a different venue?

Answer:

Because the sacrament of marriage is a sacred covenant between the husband and wife, the celebration of the sacrament of matrimony is much more than simply a social or family event. So, the rule that the sacrament be celebrated in a church is a way to help reinforce the deeper meaning of Christian marriage. To help make this clearer, the Church's tradition also normally includes the celebration of the Mass when the marriage is being celebrated between two Catholics, and so a church or chapel is the ideal setting. For special reasons — which vary from diocese to diocese — the local bishop can give permission for the marriage to be celebrated in another suitable place.

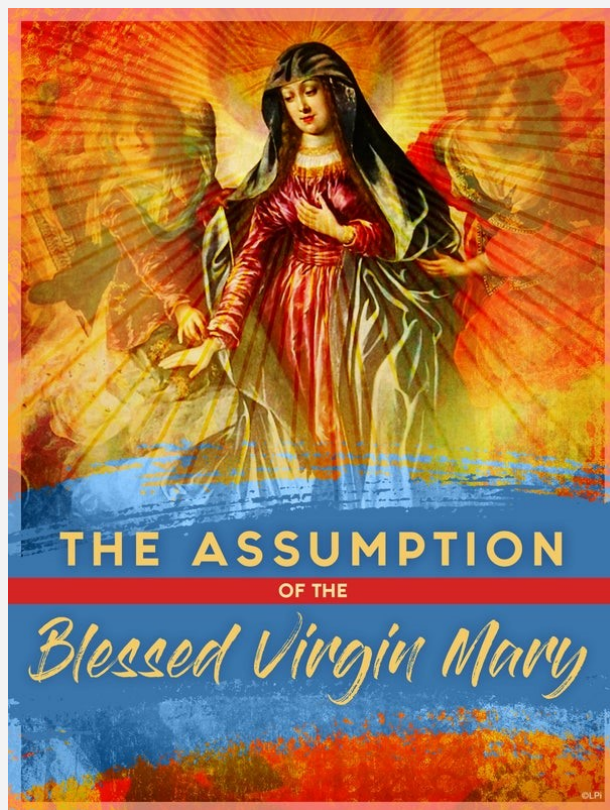
