DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

This is truly a wonderful parish weekend as we have a variety of activities that are going on throughout the weekend Masses, including, "Welcome Back to Church Sunday," the Blessing and Commissioning of our Catechists, and the Blessing of Backpacks.

WELCOME BACK TO CHURCH SUNDAY: A while ago I came across an advertisement introducing a special weekend (September 14th & 15th) where churches would "welcome back" to church their members who have been away during the summer months.

I decided to speak about this special Sunday with our priests and deacons and with members of our Welcoming Ministry. Everyone seemed enthusiastic about **Welcome Back to Church Sunday** so we decided to proceed.

Our parishioners were invited to reach out to people within our boundaries to invite them to come and be a part of our parish community. The idea we came up with was that we would place hangers on the doors of houses in our neighborhood that explain the meaning of this special weekend. Of the 1,000 door hangers that were printed, I understand that around 950 hangers were distributed by you, our parishioners. I can't tell you how delighted I am that you are sharing in the important work of reaching out to others. We call the work that you did "evangelization."

The Welcoming Ministry decided to provide food so that hopefully people will remain after Mass, to enjoy some refreshments and reach out to one another, especially, those who might be visiting us for the first time.

We welcome all those who joined us this weekend because you were personally invited. If you are not Catholic and would like more information about joining our church, please call our parish office at (516) 731-3710.

THE BLESSING OF OUR CATECHISTS: There are a number of men and women from our parish who teach in our Faith Formation Program. They are called Catechists. While many are involved with the Faith Formation of the children of our parish (35 in all), there are others who work with those seeking entrance into the Catholic Church (the OCIA), and others preparing for marriage (the FOCCUS & Pre-Cana programs).

These catechists are being blessed and commissioned at our 10:00 AM Mass this weekend. I am truly grateful to each and every one of them for assisting me in providing these most important services and ministries.

THE BLESSING OF BACKPACKS: With schools opening, I wanted to provide a blessing of the children's backpacks along with blessing of the children themselves, their parents and teachers and all school personnel and bus drivers and crossing guards.

My prayer is that the coming year will be an opportunity for an increase in knowledge, confidence, friendship and their personal growth.

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading:

I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. (Is 50:6)

Second Reading:

So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. (Jas 2:17)

Gospel:

"But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." (Mk 8:29)

Gospel Meditation

This morning I received a text message that a member of my extended family will likely die of cancer within the next few hours. His name is Luke. He is a 45-year-old husband and father of six. Though I am not as close to him as my sister (she is his sister-in-law and knows him well), I wonder: how can we, including Luke himself, manage such a terribly awful and unfair situation?

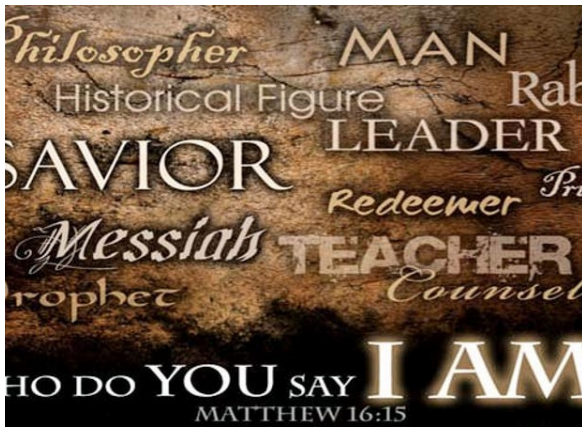
The words of this Sunday's Gospel offer a powerful and challenging path. Jesus says, "**If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me**" (Mark 8:34). Today I see with new freshness the starkness and strangeness of the words **take up**. The cross stands for suffering which is unjust, absurd, seemingly hopeless, and humiliating. Jesus doesn't say "accept" or "endure" or "tolerate," but "take up." Embrace it, actively. Choose it and lift it up for others to see what terrifies and sickens us. But somehow, for Jesus, this is the path to "**saving one's life**." A new world is breaking in, one in which love is everything, when no relationship can be wounded or die. I trust that in the embraced suffering of Luke and his loved ones, Jesus is taking up his cross and saving us all.

By the time you read this, barring a miracle, Luke will have died. He will be carrying his cross no longer. But we all still face suffering. This week let's not just endure, but take up our crosses, big and small. That's our only hope for saving our lives.

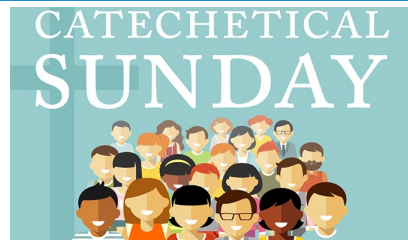

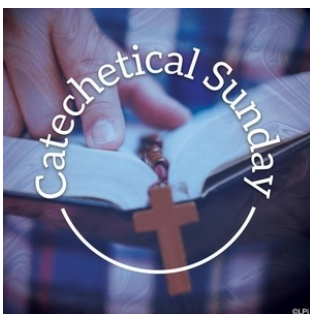

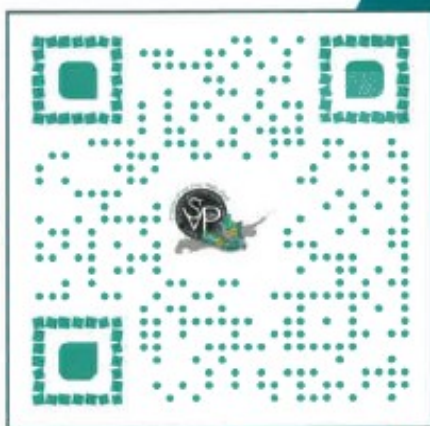

Liturgical Minister Training- Fall 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors. You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.

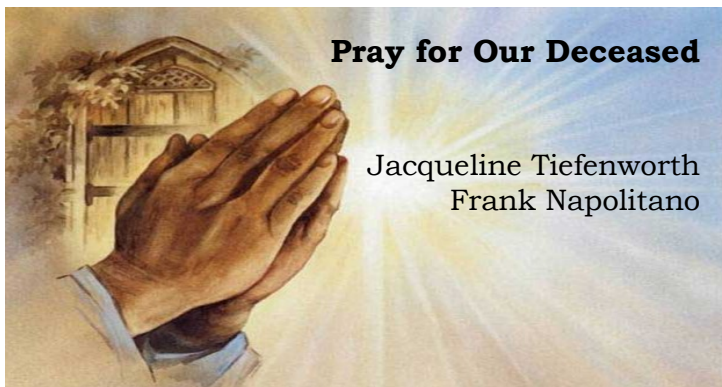

Question: Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

Q & A

Answer: The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis. Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel. Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the ongoing spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.

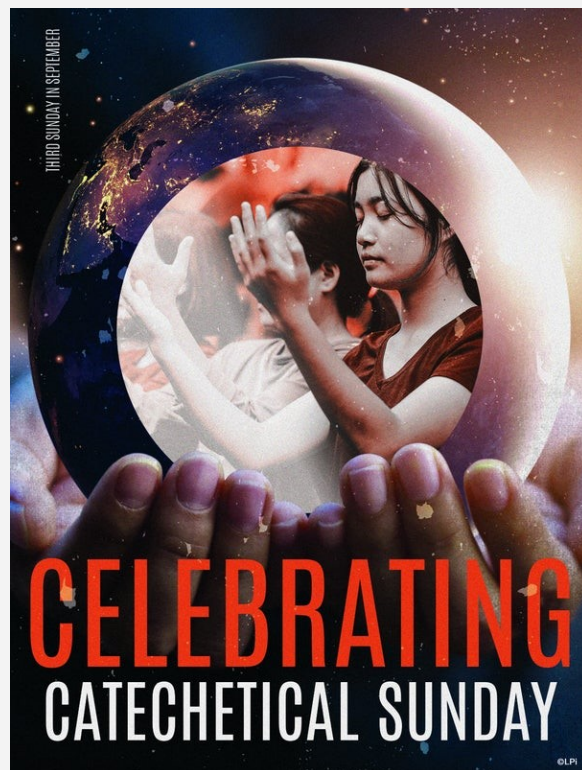
