DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

Well, the new parish year has started, September 2024 to August 2025, and things are in full swing. Several celebrations were planned and enjoyed including the blessing of backpacks, "Welcome Back to Church," the celebration of Confirmation, our Annual Blue Mass and the Blessing of Our Pets.

Our Faith Formation classes have begun. We have a total of 801 children in the Program. You might recall that several years ago we changed the name of the Program from Religious Education to Faith Formation. Why? Religious Education is about handing on information. Faith Formation is about forming practicing Catholics, disciples of Jesus today.

The primary responsibility to form children in the Catholic Faith is the responsibility of their parents. You might recall that at your wedding you were asked three questions before you exchanged your vows. The second question was, *"will you accept children lovingly from God and bring them up in the practice of the faith?"*

Our role as the local parish is to assist you in your duties as the parents of these children. We do this by providing classes, which teach them about the faith, and preparing them for the celebration of their First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

The Church assumes that as parents you are supporting what they are learning in class and bringing them to Church each Sunday for the celebration of Mass and the reception of Holy Communion. Your children must see, firsthand, that the living of their Catholic faith is supported by the regular example that you are setting for them. Together, we are forming your children to be practicing Catholics, disciples of Jesus today.

I am delighted by the work of our Faith Formation Staff, under the wonderful guidance and direction of Dr. Lucy Creed. I extend this gratitude to all those who are serving as Catechists, teachers, classroom aides, and hall monitors. They are working closely with your children.

ST JAMES CYO: This weekend the children involved with our CYO Basketball Program are present at the Sunday, 10:00 AM Family Mass. I have the privilege of acknowledging and praying for them and the adults who are working with them and offering a blessing on their basketball jerseys.

As you can see, we are off to a great start! *"May the good that the Lord has begun in us be brought to its completion."*

Gospel Meditation

From a young age, I loved winning at sports. I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction. It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win. Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus: **"Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory"** (Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indignant reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness? The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance (**"you do not know what you are asking."**). Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the **"slave of all."** The true winners are slaves of love. This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.

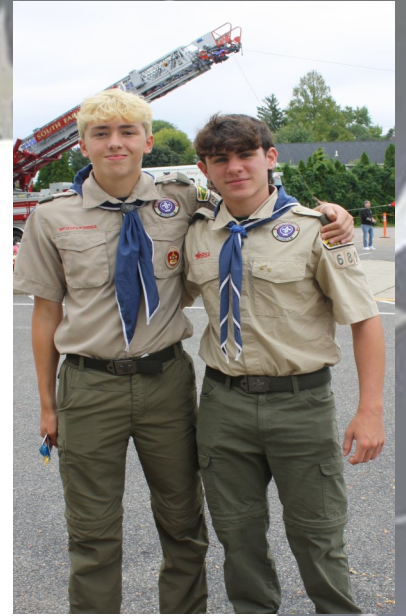

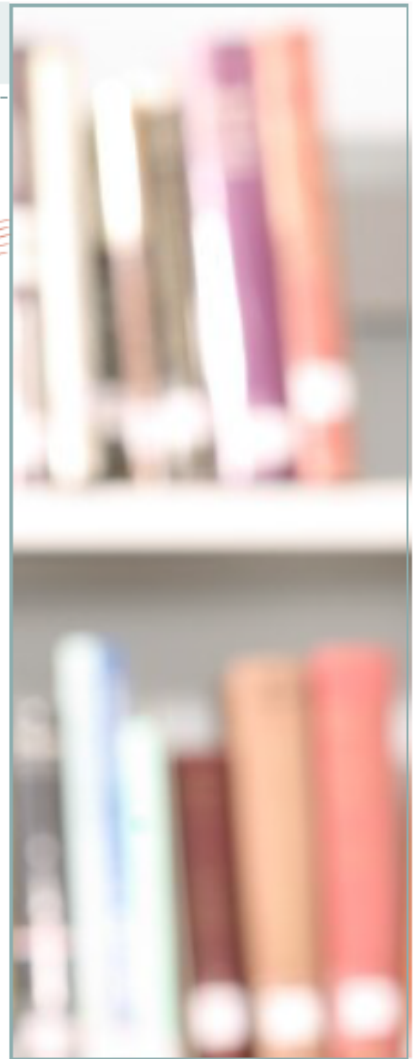

Question: Is Halloween a pagan holiday or a Catholic one?

Q & A

Answer: The short answer: nowadays, a little bit of both. But it wasn't always that way. Halloween and All Saints' Day are closely connected. In the 800s, the Catholic Church began celebrating All Saints' Day. It was originally called All Hallow's Day or Hallowmas. The celebration began early on All Hallows' Eve. But if Halloween is really about the saints in all their victorious glory, where do we get haunted houses, costumes, and pranks? All Saints' Day became associated with the other deceased rather quickly. November 2nd is All Souls Day, where we pray for the souls in purgatory. Throughout the European world, especially with the Celtic and Germanic peoples, the dead were honored in the autumn months. Within the last few hundred years, this included dressing in disguise and going door to door, asking for food in exchange for a rhyme or poem. Some people masqueraded as "dark" spirits and pulled pranks on others. Today's celebration of Halloween tends to take on these later practices, rather than the original meaning of celebrating the saints. But remember ... this feast was Catholic first!
