DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

GARAGE SALE: Last Sunday we held our first Garage Sale. It was made possible through the cooperation of members of the Welcoming Committee, our St. Vincent DePaul Parish Conference and our Parish Social Ministry.

We first spoke about this idea during a St. Vincent DePaul meeting several months ago. Liz Regan had the opportunity to attend a similar sale at Maria Regina Parish several weeks before. After presenting the idea of doing the same here at St. James we had a lively discussion and decided to proceed.

Preparations were made by various team members and we also reached out to our parishioners looking for additional help in organizing this undertaking.

The dates were set, and we began advertising for a variety of donations from our parishioners. We were overwhelmed and amazed by the generosity and the number of items that were donated.

After setting the tables, we were ready to open our doors to the Garage Sale this past Sunday at 8:30 which continued to 2:30 PM.

We had a good number of people who stopped by during that time. In the end we were able to raise about \$7,500, which will be used to support the service and ministries of our Welcoming Committee, our St. Vincent DePaul Parish Conference and our Parish Social Ministry, each receiving \$2,500.

The cleanup of Delaney Hall afterwards was time consuming, and a good number of items that remained were boxed and donated to the St. Vincent DePaul Thrift Shop and the Breast Cancer Coalition to assist others in need.

Many thanks to everyone involved. We had over 40 volunteers who participated in this very successful undertaking. I look forward to being able to do this again next year especially after learning firsthand the lessons on how to run a Garage Sale more smoothly.

CYO BASKETBALL: Our CYO basketball program currently has 11 teams, consisting of 108 players and 23 coaches. Last Sunday the girls teams attended the 10am Mass for a special blessing of their jerseys. I am grateful to all who are involved in this program, especially our coordinators, Michael Foschino, Kristin Ranfone and Cindy Schmidt. I look forward to blessing the boys jerseys at a future Mass. I wish all of the teams a very successful basketball season!

Gospel Meditation

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

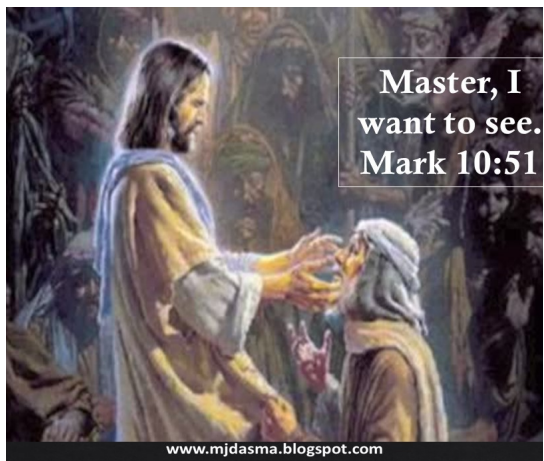
That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, **"Master, let me receive my sight."** Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

Due to the lack of freezer space, we are requesting gift cards to purchase the turkeys.

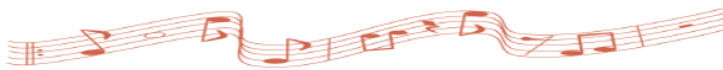
Gift cards can be dropped at the Book Nook gift shop (in the Narthex), put in the collection basket or brought to the parish center office.

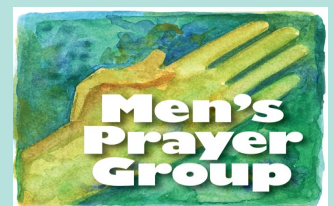

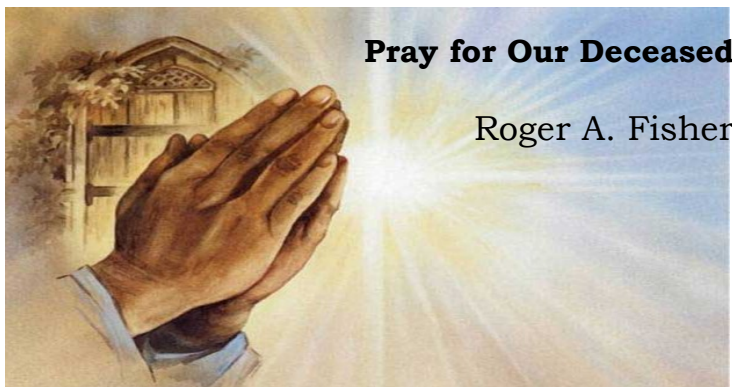

Question: November is called the month of All Souls. More recently, it has been called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Can you tell us more about this feast and the remembrances of this month?

Q & A

Answer: November 2nd, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, dovetails with November 1st, the feast of All Saints. The saints, our models of Christian living, are one with God in heaven. All the faithful departed are those who have died with hope and trust in a loving God who calls us to greater growth and development, even beyond death. This growth and development occurs in a state of being that we have traditionally called purgatory. Today, belief in purgatory allows one who has died in Christ to continue growing and developing before meeting God face to face. God continually invites communion with these loved ones, but some feel the need to continue growing and developing before entering into full communion with God.

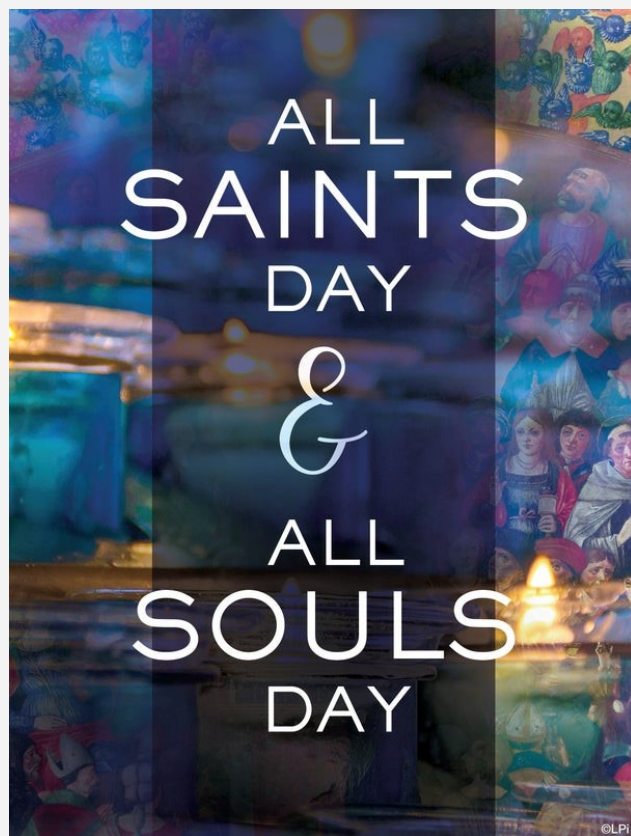
