DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

I would like to share with you the announcement that I made at the end of each Mass last weekend to give you an update on the situation of the Diocese being in Chapter 11 and its possible resolution in the months ahead.

"You may have seen that the press has been covering developments in the Diocese's bankruptcy case. As you know, the Diocese has been in bankruptcy since 2020. The goal is to equitably compensate survivors of abuse, to end all historical lawsuits against the Diocese and parishes, and to allow the Church to continue her mission.

In order to compensate survivors and protect the parishes from lawsuits, the Diocese and every parish will be contributing to the settlement. To protect the parishes from any additional past liability, it will be necessary for every parish to enter into an abbreviated Chapter 11. This does not mean that the parish is in jeopardy of closing. Please do not panic if you hear it reported that parishes are "declaring bankruptcy". As always, do not automatically believe everything you hear or read from the media.

The diocesan and parish plans have not yet been confirmed. However, we want you to be informed so that you are not surprised by anything that might be reported in the press. In the coming weeks, more detailed information will be provided in our bulletin. Please know that we will keep you fully informed as details are confirmed. Our highest goals are to resolve any potential liabilities and to secure the future for our parish."

The Diocese's goal has always been the equitable compensation of survivors of abuse while allowing the Church to continue her essential mission. We believe that this plan will achieve those goals.

As I write this letter on Monday, September 30th, I have not yet received any updates. I believe that I will hear something by the end of this week.

I have a profound concern for the survivors of the abuse. While each one of them reacted to these horrible acts in different ways, the trauma that must be on-going is quite disturbing. My prayers for them have always been for their interior healing with the hope that many of them have experienced counseling.

Join me in praying for these survivors and for our diocese that we will all heal from this trauma as we continue the work entrusted to us.

Gospel Meditation

As a young pastor years ago, I met with a middle-aged couple who had been divorced and civilly remarried. They were frustrated that an annulment had to precede a Church marriage. Sympathizing with their plight, I promised to walk with them along their journey. Once as we sat in my office, the man said to me, "Why is the Church so difficult on marriage?" I replied, "Actually, Jesus' teaching is what's difficult." He furrowed his brow and asked what I meant.

We opened the Bible and together read today's gospel passage from Mark 10:12 in which Jesus says,

"Whoever divorces his wife and marries another, commits adultery with her..." My two friends sat in silent astonishment. Surely Jesus understands the complexities of human life and sexual love. The words hung thick and heavy in the air. How could the merciful Lord be so seemingly unrealistic in his expectations, especially with so much divorce and remarriage in our world?

I didn't know what to say. So, we kept reading. Next, Jesus says, **"Let the children come to me."** The innocence of children allows them to receive and give love, to trust unconditionally, to believe in love that endures. Most children aren't yet jaded by statistics, broken hearts, or dysfunctional relationships. Children remind us of the world to come. The couple and I began to talk about child-like trust in Jesus and his teaching, and we continued to move forward. When it comes to the Church's demanding teaching on marriage, it's best to approach it as trusting children, whatever situations in which we find ourselves.

Children's Christmas Pageant



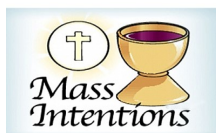

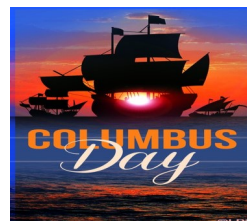


October 6-Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Question: I read in the catechism that marriage is indissoluble. Why then does the Church issue annulments?

Q & A

Answer: Sacramental marriage is indeed indissoluble. You can find this in several places in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Indissolubility is foundational to the union of marriage (CCC 1646) and required by spousal love (CCC 1644). This quality of marriage draws its meaning from the fidelity of Jesus to his Bride, the Church (CCC 1647). Spouses give themselves forever to each other. Through the vows and their consummation, the spouses form a covenantal bond that binds them as one. Indissolubility presumes and depends on this sacramental bond between the spouses. Sometimes, however, there are impediments to marriage that are overlooked, poorly understood, or unknown. It is possible that at the time of the vows, something was either present or absent that made the consent invalid. The ceremony itself does not bring about the sacrament. The priest is the official witness of the Church, but he is not the minister of the sacrament. The husband and wife are the ministers of the sacrament to each other. Without the full, free, and able consent of the man and the woman, no sacrament takes place. An annulment does not destroy the marriage bond. It is an acknowledgement that the sacramental bond did not form in the first place.

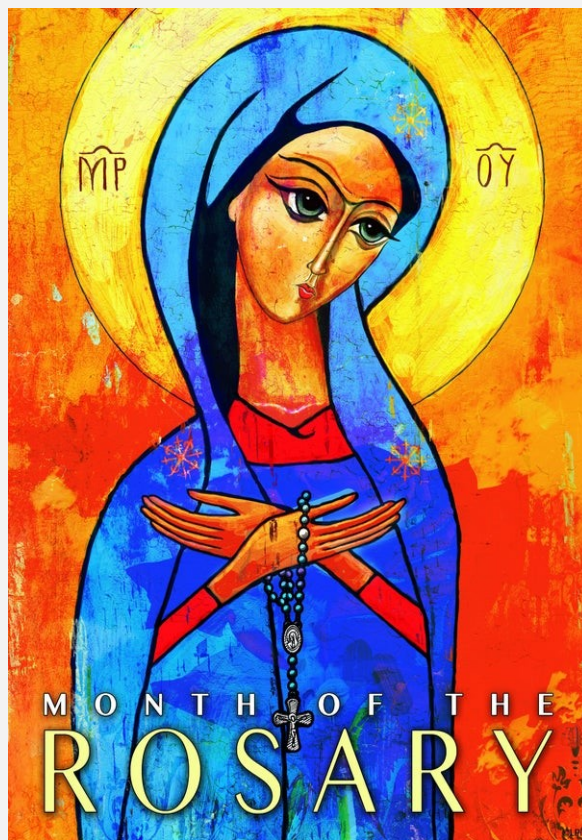
