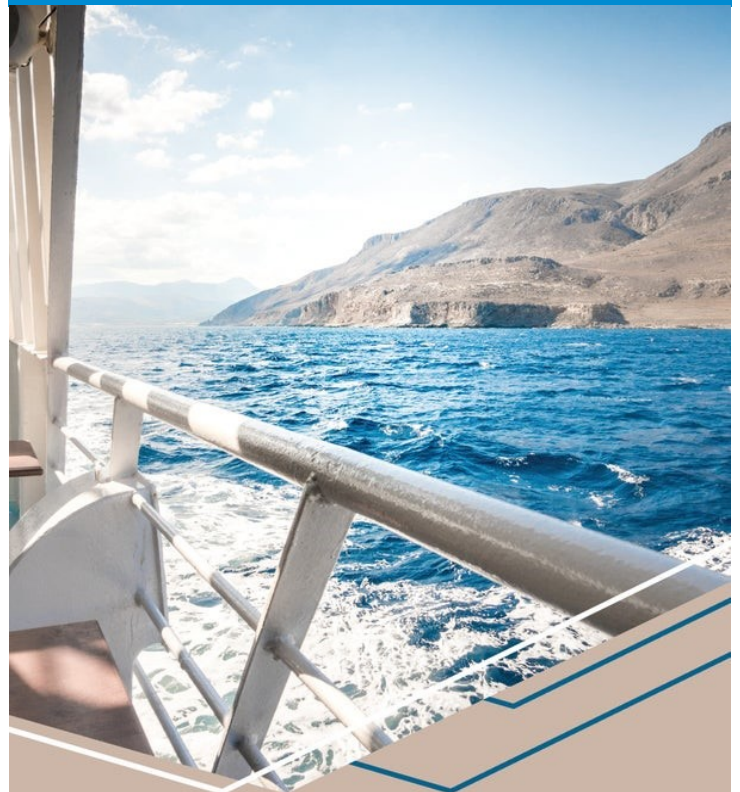

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

Last weekend members of the Life Center spoke to us about this year's Baby Bottle Campaign, which is taking place during the month of February. Their work supports those pregnant mothers choosing to give birth to their unborn children but need some assistance to be able to do this. In the past, many of our parishioners generously supported this campaign assisting the efforts of the "Life Center." I am grateful for the Boy Scouts and the Knights of Columbus who assisted with the distribution of bottles.

Baby Bottles should be returned to the Church on the weekend of March 1st & 2nd. That weekend baskets will be available for your filled Baby Bottles.

Kindly return the bottles filled with your coins, bills or a check made payable to the "Life Center." The Knights of Columbus will assist with the bottle return. Members of the Life Center will come in early March to pick up the Baby Bottles.

I want to thank you in advance for your participation in the Baby Bottle Campaign as together we are doing something to assist these pregnant women.

MORAL CATHOLIC TEACHINGS: The sanctity of human life from the very first moment of conception to one's natural death is a moral teaching of the Church.

Our culture reflects *relativism*, which holds that *you have your beliefs, and I have mine and don't try to change my mind*. As Catholics, along with people of other religions and sharing similar moral beliefs, we need to enter into the political sphere and vote for those candidates who share our beliefs and remedies. How often I have heard people complain that some Catholics are talking "politics" when speaking about these values! In fact, we are addressing moral principles, which we want our government's laws and rules to reflect.

It is imperative that we understand this truth and act accordingly. While there are many who hold fast to the traditional moral teachings of the Church, there are growing numbers, especially among the young, who believe that our thinking is backwards and outdated. God's teachings cannot be seen in this way. His teachings are rightfully meant to be passed down from generation to generation.

OUR PERSONAL MORAL VALUES: Are your moral values in communion with that of the Catholic Church? I have found in working with couples preparing for marriage that they are either unfamiliar with the moral teachings of the Catholic Church or they know these teachings and have rejected them. This continues to be a challenge demanding the Church's attention and resolution. Please pray for the Church.

Gospel Meditation

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought: "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch.

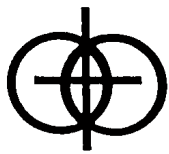

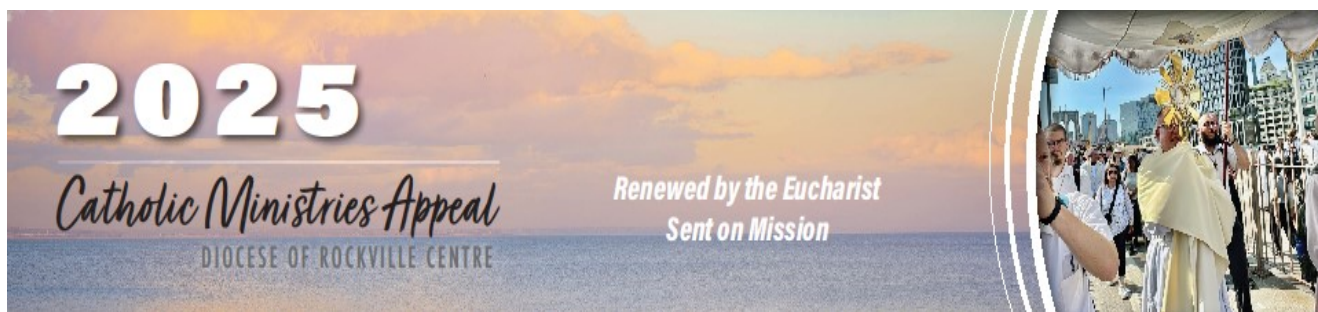

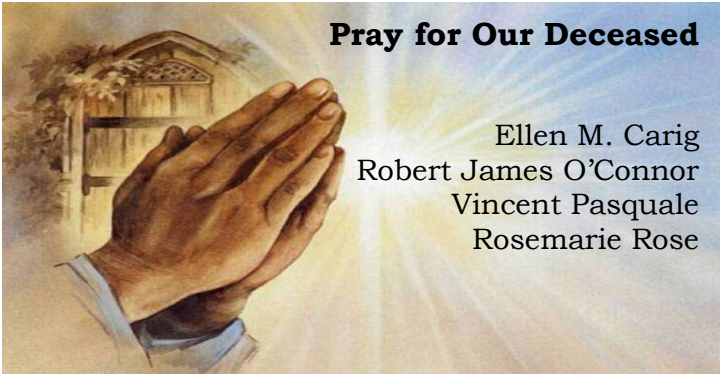

Question: Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

Q & A

Answer: This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems, and issues—good and bad—of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy. With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail.

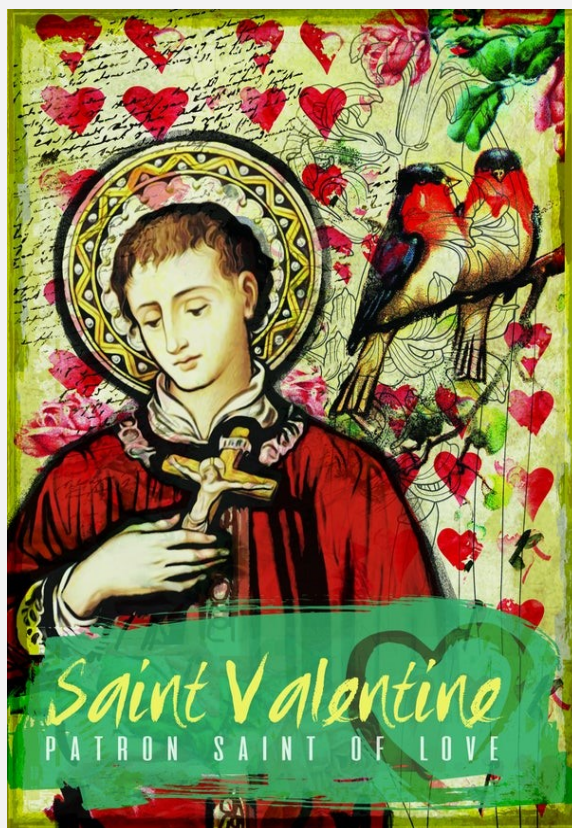
