**DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:**

**DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY:** Prior to his death on April 2, 2005, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina Kowalska in 2000 and proclaimed the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Many Roman Catholic have embraced this feast with open hearts.

The readings and prayers for this feast continue to be those of the Second Sunday of Easter. We are recognizing this Sunday of Mercy at St. James within in the prayer of the faithful as we implore God to shower his merciful love upon all of us. Several years ago the image of Divine Mercy was enthroned in the church for our public and private devotion. In addition, we recently placed paintings of St. Faustina Kowalska and Pope St. John Paul II.

A plenary indulgence, the complete forgiveness of sins and the remission of all temporal punishment due to them, can be obtained by anyone who receives Holy Communion on Mercy Sunday, goes to confession and prays for the Holy Father. The Congregation for Divine Worship has determined that the requirement to go to confession can be fulfilled by going to confession on Divine Mercy Sunday or by any person who has gone to confession within twenty days prior to or after the Feast of Mercy.

It is appropriate that our Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI celebrated the beatification of Pope John Paul II on this feast that fell on May 1, 2011. Pope John Paul II had a special devotion to the feast and spent his pontificate promoting the abundance of "divine mercy."

Let us join our prayers together in the hope that many people will observe this feast including those who would most benefit from its observance. The mercy of God is available in abundance. May our merciful Lord shower us in his mercy and fill us with his peace!

In his book, ***"The Name of God is Mercy"*** Pope Francis, who recently passed away, wrote: *"To follow the way of the Lord, the Church is called on to dispense its mercy over all those who recognize themselves as sinners, who assume responsibility for the evil they have committed, and who feel in need of forgiveness. The Church does not exist to condemn people, but to bring about an encounter with the visceral love of God's mercy."* May Pope Francis now experience the tremendous merciful love of God, who is Mercy.

## **WEEKLY READINGS AND OBSERVANCES**

### **2nd Sunday of Easter**

**April 27, 2025**

#### **First Reading:**

Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. (Acts 5:12)

#### **Psalm:**

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting. (Ps 118) Or: Alleluia.

#### **Second Reading:**

When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid." (Rv 1:17)

#### **Gospel:**

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:19)

#### **Gospel Meditation**

It's common for Catholics to hear the question, "Why do I have to go to a priest to have my sins forgiven?" I've never liked that question because not only is it clunky (confession is the ordinary way for the pardoning of serious sins, not lesser ones). But it misses the larger context: the wonderful origins of the sacrament itself. And this context is deeply Jewish.

Ancient Jews associated forgiveness of sins with priests offering sacrifices in the Jerusalem temple. It was a solemn, public, and tangible way to access God's mercy. So when the risen Jesus breathes on the Apostles and says, "**Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained**" (John 20:23), the upshot is remarkable: he is the new temple and his Apostles are the new priests. Jerusalem is no longer the place to find forgiveness from sin. Jesus' body, the Church, is.

So why should we go to the Sacrament of Confession? For the same reason ancient Jews went to the temple in Jerusalem: to experience the intimacy, joy, and life-giving power of God's eternal forgiveness.

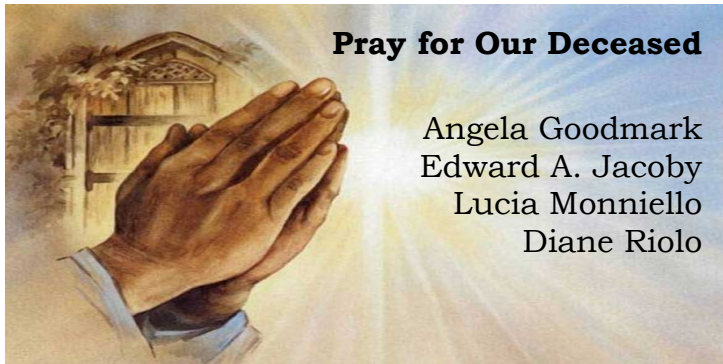

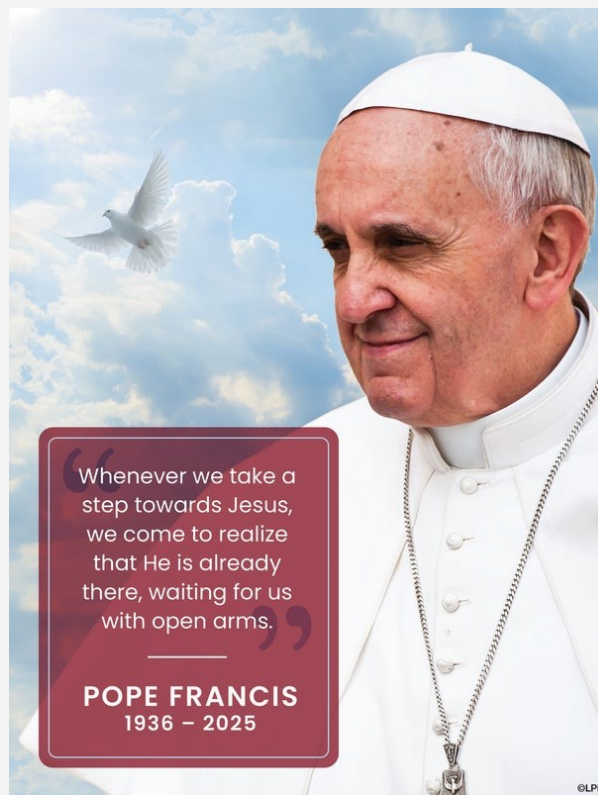
