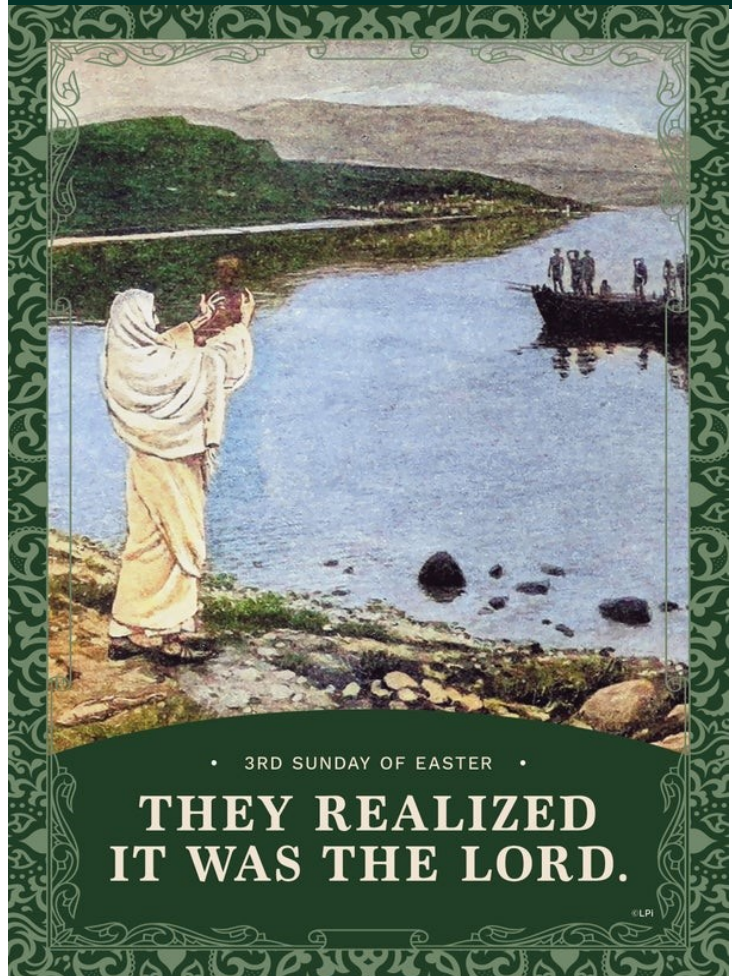

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

THE WORK OF THE EASTER SEASON:

During the Season of Lent we prepared, through works of charity, fasting and prayer, for the renewal of our Baptismal Promises on Easter Sunday. The Season of Easter provides us with the opportunity to reflect on what it means to be a baptized member of the church. It is not enough to identify ourselves as being Catholics. We need to discover how we can live out our baptism concretely in our daily lives.

Hopefully, our regular participation in the Sunday Mass, assists us in this discovery. Our prayerful listening and reflection on the Sunday readings and the homily given by the priest or deacon will lead us to a greater understanding of the challenges we face as the present-day disciples of Jesus. Yes, applying the Scriptures to the real situations that we find ourselves is crucial to concretely living out our discipleship.

THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION: The celebration of Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist are called the Sacraments of Initiation. Traditionally, the Sacraments were celebrated in that order. Ultimately, we are being initiated into Jesus Christ through our sharing in the Eucharist: the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, that is, the true presence of the Risen Christ.

OPPORTUNITIES TO DEEPEN OUR FAITH: There are several courses that we offer regularly for adults to deepen your faith in Jesus and to explore ways that we can express that faith. These courses include Scripture studies, the study of the Bible, both the Old and New Testaments, our Alpha Program and separate Men and Women's Sharing Groups. Everyone is welcome to join. Please consider taking a positive step in your Adult Faith Formation.

ADULT CONFIRMATION COURSE:

The celebration of Confirmation is an important Sacrament to prepare for and receive and is one of the sacraments of initiation. If you are an adult Catholic who has never been confirmed, we are offering preparation classes for parishioners 18 years or older who are already baptized and desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Classes begin Tuesday May 13th, 2025, at 7:30pm and run for four weeks (May 13th, 20th, 27th and June 3rd). The Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered at the Mass on Pentecost Sunday June 8th, 2025, at St James. The Church also encourages those seeking the Sacrament of Marriage to be Confirmed. SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

St. James Parish welcomes any non-Catholic who seeks to enter the Catholic Church or baptized Catholics of any age who have not yet received the other Sacraments. Please call the Parish Center (731-3710).

MARRIAGES:

Those wishing to be married at St. James should call the Parish Office (731-3710) to arrange an appointment with one of the parish clergy. Please allow 6 months at least for the necessary preparations. Please do not enter into any other wedding commitments prior to having your wedding date and time confirmed by the Parish.

3rd Sunday of Easter

May 4, 2025

First Reading:

God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. (Acts 5:31)

Psalm:

I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me. (Ps 30) Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading:

"To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." (Rv 5:13)

Gospel:

Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. (Jn 21:5-6)

Gospel Meditation

I eat breakfast. If I don't have something substantial, I'm fading by midmorning. Breakfast is my key meal because it sets up my physical wellbeing for the rest of the day.

Spiritually speaking, we need sustenance to get us going. This is true for the Apostles in this Sunday's remarkable Gospel reading. The risen Jesus makes his third appearance to them in the early morning light and calls, **"Come, have breakfast" (John 21:12)**. The exhausted and cold fishermen sit, and he feeds them bread and fish as the dawn breaks. They are overwhelmed by his presence to the point of awestruck silence. As they eat, their bodies and their hearts come alive. Once refreshed by their morning meal, they will be ready to feed others — indeed, the whole world — with the love of the risen Jesus. But first, they need breakfast from him.

Do you realize how essential early morning prayer is? Jesus desires to refresh us every morning with his word of love, with his grace-filled presence. This week, hear Jesus calling to you: "Come, have breakfast!" Embrace some form of spiritual, meditative practice each morning for spiritual strength to get you going.

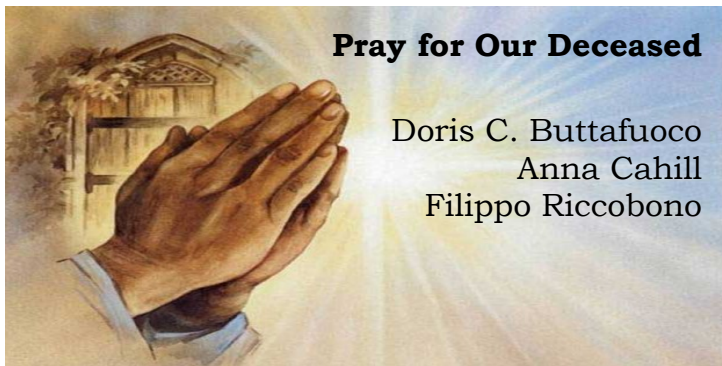
