A Note from the Pastor



DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY: This weekend we are celebrating Father's Day. I've mentioned in the past that my father was instrumental by his example to teach me that work was an important contribution that each man makes. That certainly instilled in me the value of working hard.

I am grateful that our culture sets aside time for us to honor our mothers and fathers, whether living or deceased. The experience of family life, especially, with both a mother and father are important.

I hope that as we celebrate Father's Day this weekend that we can relish many memories of our dads. For those of us whose fathers are deceased maybe it is a time of sadness or a time to laugh as we share those memories of the particular things our father did that were so humorous.

At all of the Masses this weekend we will have a special blessing after the Prayer of the Faithful for all the fathers who are present and for all the dads of our parish.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY: This weekend we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity's is understood as God's inner life, a relationship of love and communion. It is for this reason that the Church has consistently taught that marriage and family life are the clearest expression of God's inner life.

Perhaps, this year's celebration of the Most Holy Trinity will assist us in having a greater understanding of marriage as the union of a man and woman, whose love for each other is open to bringing new life into the world, the life of their children.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST: Recently, I shared with you the decision to reintroduce receiving Holy Communion under both species.

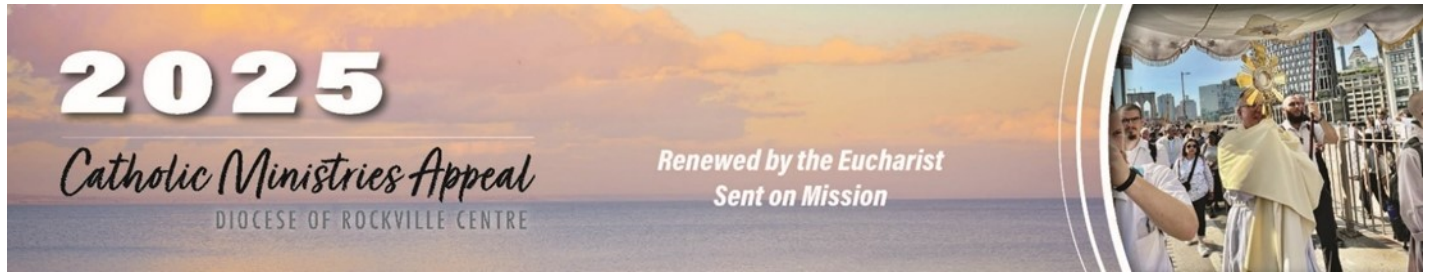
At our most recent clergy meeting we decided to start next weekend, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, at the 12pm Mass. Therefore, those who attend this Mass will have the opportunity to receive both the consecrated bread and wine. It is our hope that many of you will respond positively to this reintroduction. By doing so we more fully respond to the special call ***"to eat his body and to drink his blood."***

We will do this each Sunday at the Noon Mass, with the hope that we will be able to add both species to a second Sunday Mass after Labor Day.

EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION: Next Sunday (June 22), at the conclusion of the 12pm Mass, weather permitting, we will have an outdoor procession around the perimeter of the parish grounds. What a wonderful way of expressing our love for the Eucharist and bearing witness to our faith conviction by publicly extending this devotion to all who might pass by and see us in procession with the Eucharist.

I hope that many of you will choose to participate in this wonderful procession. If you attend another Mass, please consider coming back for this Eucharistic Procession next Sunday.

Liturgical Life

Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Today, consider a dad like Paul. Paul saw information about the Catholic Ministries Appeal at his local parish, and he knew he had to turn to the Church for help since he had nowhere else to go. Paul had been gainfully employed for more than 10 years when he began to fall ill. Soon his medical issues made it impossible for him to keep working and he was forced to go out on disability.

After paying the co-pays on his medications, his family's rent and utilities bills, Paul had very little left to purchase food and other necessities for his family.

It was hard for him to ask for help, but with nowhere else to turn, he did. Catholic Charities found him a specialist who assessed the family's needs and directed them to appropriate resources in their community. He went to his Parish Outreach, where his family received food that allowed them to make it through the month. Paul and his family received the help they so desperately needed.

Today, Paul is back to work and the family is doing well. *"I am so thankful that I know there is somewhere I can turn, where there are people that care, people I can talk to, if I am ever in such a situation again,"* shared Paul.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways. For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to his Apostles, **"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now"** (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before his resurrection and ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So he does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as he teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what he is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in him and his Apostles), he never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: he knows what you are ready to learn now.

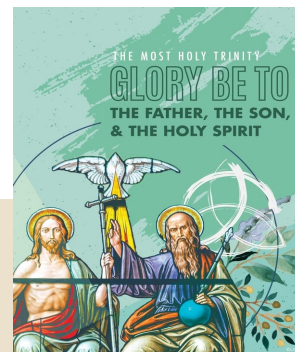

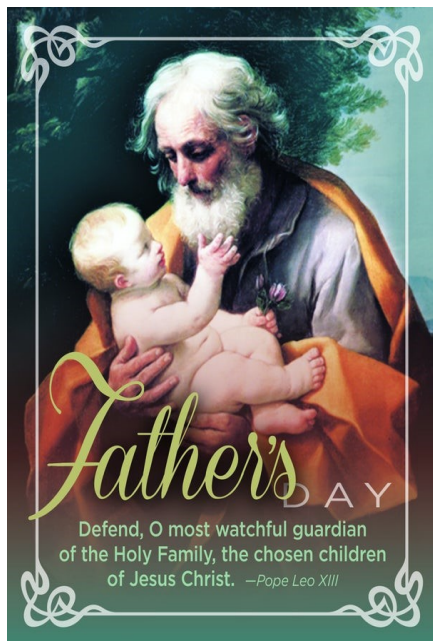

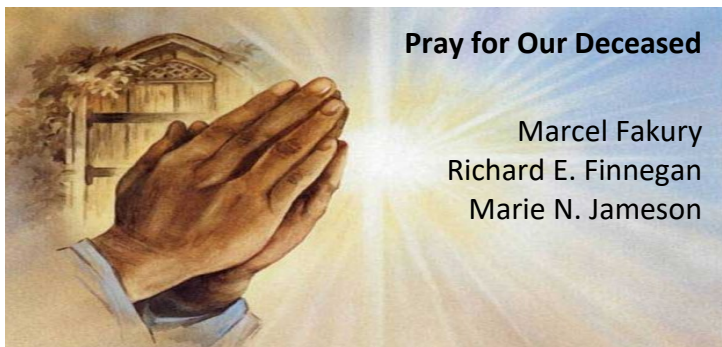

Question: I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?

Q & A

Answer: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals). An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions? One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.
