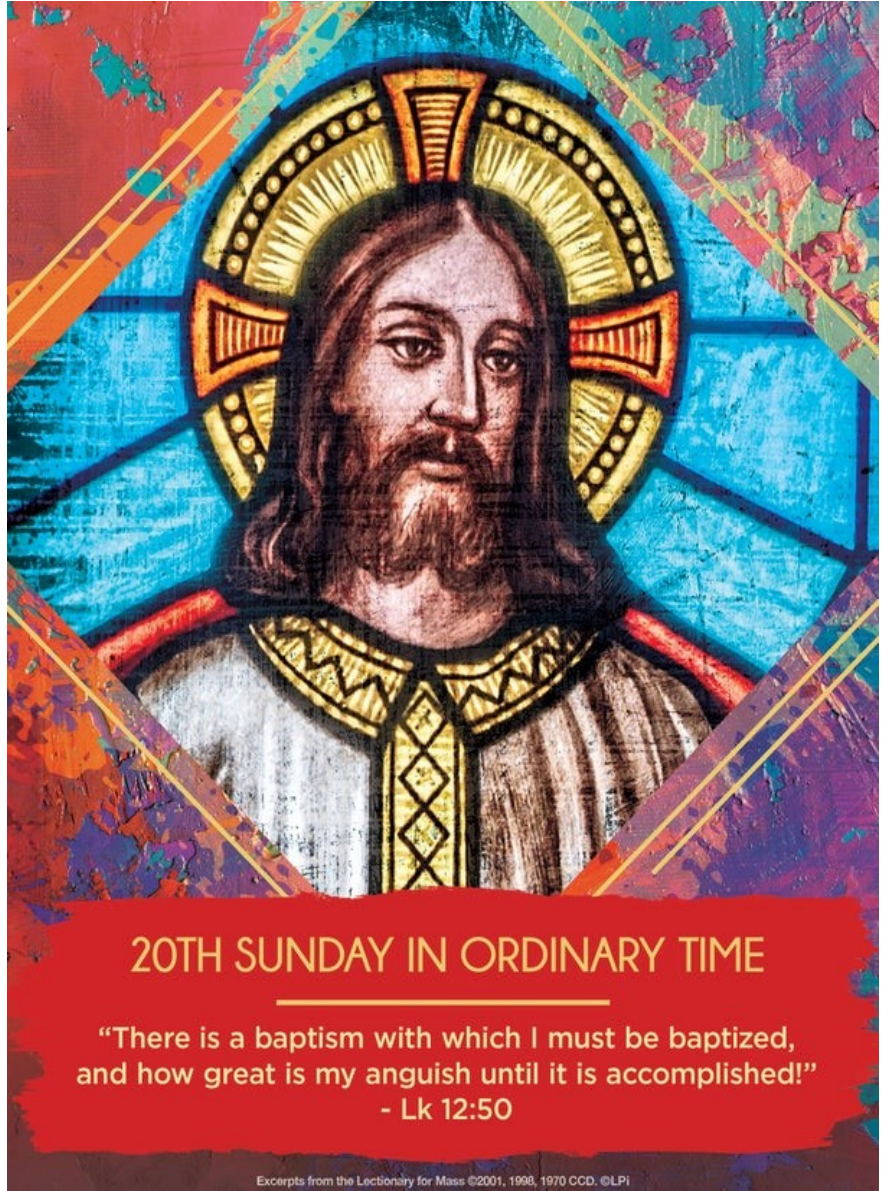
OUR MISSION

A Note from the Pastor



DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

MY RECENT TRIP TO STATEN ISLAND: By the way, do you know how Staten Island got its name? When the Dutch first sailed into what is now called New York Harbor, the sailor in the Crow's Nest looked down that Captain and said, "Captain, is stat en island?" And the name was adopted from that very day. It is called Staten Island even now. *Again, I won't give up my day job.*

I went to Staten Island to visit a store that is open to clergy, selling church articles and furnishings at very reasonable prices. I had been the week before and purchased a Votive Candle stand for the Chapel and another one for pieces that were missing from one of the stands in the Church.



I went back again on Thursday, August 7th, because I saw two statues that I wanted to purchase during my first visit. When I got there the two that I wanted were still available. Or so I thought. You see there was priest who came in before me wanting to purchase 8 or 10 statues for a chapel that he was building. You guessed correctly. Two of those statues were the ones I went there to buy. His purchase left two remaining statues. One was St. Monica and I wasn't really sure to the other's identity.

I printed the picture of the saint, both on our FaceBook page and that of the Clergy asking, "Does anyone know who this saint is? I received several guesses from a number of parishioners. However, that evening I received a message from Fr. Mariusz Gorazd, who was recently with us. He indicated correctly that the saint was St. Peregrine Laziosi. Wikipedia writes, "Peregrine Laziosi (Pellegrino Latiosi; c. 1260 – 1 May 1345) is an Italian saint of the *Servite Order* (*Friar Order Servants of Mary*). He is the *patron saint* for persons suffering from *cancer*, AIDS, and other life-threatening illness."

Now knowing this I was so grateful that I purchased this statue. How many of our parishioners have family members or friends with this illness? How many of our parishioners are dealing with same?

THE STATUE OF ST. PEREGRINE LAZIOSI: I made the decision to place his statue in our Chapel, giving all of us the opportunity to stop by and ask for his intercession. The statue of St. Peregrine is displayed to the left of the fireplace.

PRAYERS TO ST. PEREGRINE: I hope that many of you will take advantage of this new shrine. I don't believe my purchasing of his statue was an accident. God knew that I have family members dealing with cancer, who are in my regular prayers. I will now have the opportunity to pray before St. Peregrine's statue as I hope you will too.

The Vatican announced that Blessed Carlo Acutis and
Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young Catholics
beloved for their vibrant faith and witness to holiness,
will be canonized together on September 7.

Blessed Acutis, a teenager known for his devotion to the
Eucharist and creating an online exhibition of Eucharistic
miracles, was born in 1991 and raised in Milan, Blessed
Acutis used his tech skills to evangelize and was noted
for his joyful faith and compassion for others before
dying of leukemia in 2006 at age 15.

Blessed Frassati, born in 1901 into a prominent family
in Turin, Italy, was admired for his deep spirituality, love
for the poor and enthusiasm for life. A member of the
Dominican Third Order, he served the sick through the
St. Vincent de Paul Society. He died at age 24 after
contracting polio, possibly from one of the people he
assisted.

Lectors are encouraged to read scripture in a clear and meaningful way so that everyone can hear and understand what is being said.

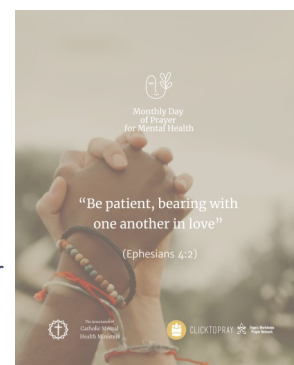

GOSPEL MEDITATION

During my baseball career, my best coach often said, “You shouldn’t be worried if I yell at you. Be worried if I don’t. If I stop pushing you, it means I don’t think you have any more potential.” He demanded a lot, and I knew it meant he saw that I could be something special on the baseball field.

Jesus says some demanding words to us this week. **“Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth?”** he asks, **“No, tell you, but rather division” (Luke 12:51).** He wants you and me—in fact, all the earth—to participate in the luminous glory of God. That’s why he speaks of himself as a divine arsonist. Divine fire is like a good coach: it demands the removal of all that obstructs the achievement of the lofty goal.

Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. But for us who believe in the one who comes to set the earth of fire, we should be much more worried if he stops demanding so much from us. In fact, let’s thank him for it. Question: Why do we have a feast for the Queenship of Mary?

Q & A

Answer: For many of us, the language of kings and queens may seem like they belong to history or a medieval movie. Royalty have absolute authority over a kingdom and their subjects, a concept that is foreign to many of us today. While Jesus doesn't rule a political kingdom, we honor and recognize him as the King of Kings, Lord of Heaven and Earth. To God alone belongs absolute authority over all of existence. We may think of queens as the spouse of the king, but there is another key relationship: the king's mother. In Biblical history, we see instances where the mother of the king is given due as a queen herself, complete with a throne! Mary's guiding influence over her Son is seen most notably in the Wedding Feast at Cana. Mary is not Queen on her own merit. She is "full of grace" and "blessed" in "all ages" because of the reign of her Son.
