A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION:

Last Friday, September 12th, we had the celebration of Confirmation. Bishop Romero was the celebrant.

Honestly, one of my biggest concerns was whether or not the youngsters who had received Confirmation would actually come to Mass last weekend. I think that there were probably 5 or 6 students who attended Mass out of the 94 who were confirmed.

St. Carlo Acutis, who was canonized a saint last Sunday wrote about this concern before his death at the age of 15 from leukemia. He wrote that the greatest challenge that the church would face would be from the inside, not outsiders attacking us. I believe that this is happening more frequently.

It happens fairly frequently that I have a conversation with grandparents concerned that many of their grandchildren are not practicing the faith. They also tell me that the parents of their grandchildren do not lead by example.

I am not discouraged by this situation. I see this as directing the focus of the church starting with each individual parish. Throughout the present "parish year" the priests, deacons and other parish leaders will carefully consider solutions. Please feel free to share your personal thoughts and ideas with me by way of a letter, email, personal meeting or even by phone.

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY:

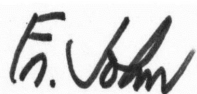
This Sunday the Catholic Church, throughout the United States, is celebrating Catechetical Sunday. We remember our responsibility to share our faith with others, especially, our children. You might recall that several years ago we changed the name of our Religious Education Program to Faith Formation. The reason this was done was that the focus of Religious Education is passing on information about our faith. The focus of Faith Formation is "forming" ourselves and the children of the parish into "disciples" of Jesus.

I want to express my gratitude to Dr. Lucy Creed, the Director of our Faith Formation Program, along with her Staff and all the catechists in our Faith Formation Program. I also want to thank those parishioners who are also doing the work of catechesis through our Pre-Cana Program, the OCIA (the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) preparing adults to enter the Catholic Church by celebrating Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist or making "Full Communion" in the Catholic Church from other Protestant religions, those preparing the parents of the infants for Baptism along with other programs of Faith Formation for Adults.

OUR ANNUAL BLUE MASS:

Next Sunday, September 28th, we will once again be celebrating our annual Blue Mass, which honors all firefighters, police officers, EMTs and other areas of public service. I am sending a warm invitation to all of you both retired and active duty, to join us for this special Mass along with your family and friends. 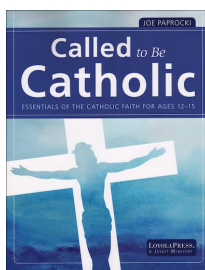

Liturgical Minister Training– Fall 2025

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors. You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. “Really great work, John,” he said. “I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay.” I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the **“master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently” (Luke 16:8)**. What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he *wants* us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!

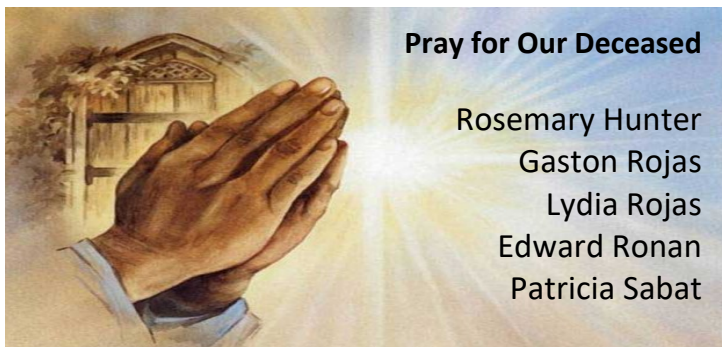

Question: Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

Q & A

Answer: The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. Through these acts, Jesus shares the good news of salvation and invites all people to share in the life and love of God. The church continues this mission in all its ministries, but especially, and perhaps most importantly, through catechesis. Catechetical Sunday is celebrated on the third Sunday of September. The task of handing on the Gospel is entrusted to the whole community, who by word and example, form young and new members in the way of the Gospel. Parish programs assist parents in teaching the basics of faith through liturgical experience, instruction, and faith formation. This ministry is essential for the parish to grow, for individuals to develop as believers, and for the ongoing spiritual formation of the whole community. It reminds the church that preaching the Gospel and growing in faith are essential to our sacramental practice and our liturgical prayer.
