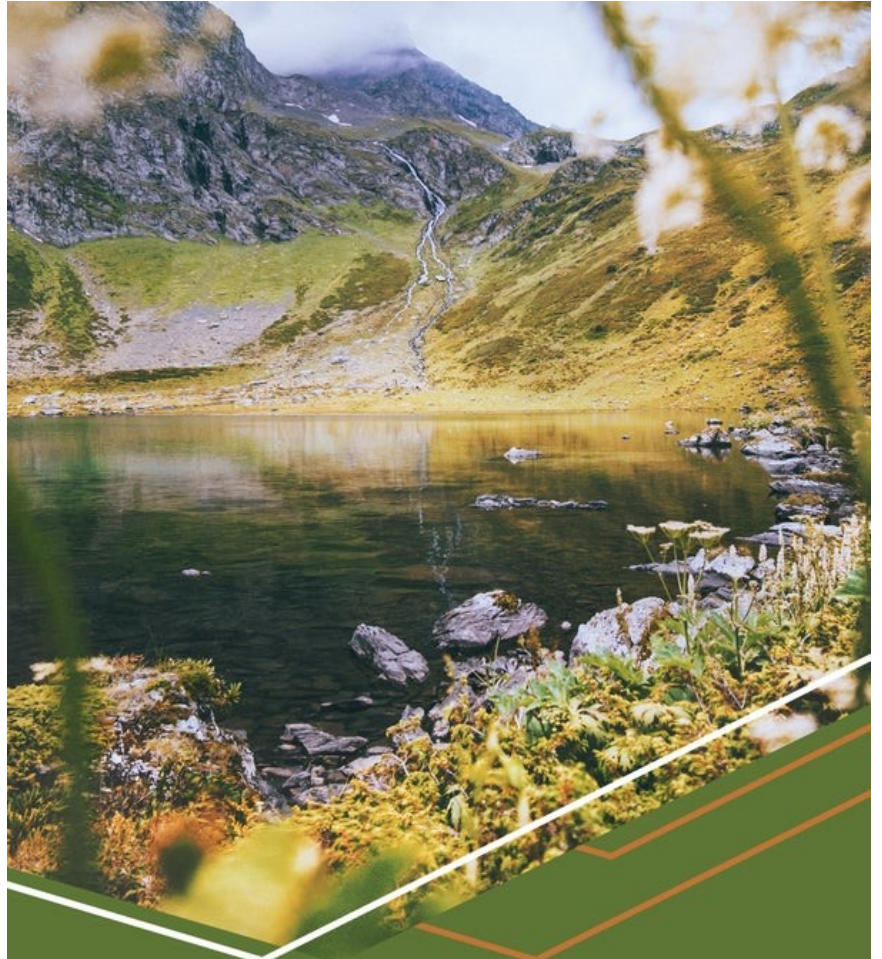
OUR MISSION

A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

2026 - A YEAR OF VERY SPECIAL EVENTS: I have been meeting with a newly formed Committee to plan some special events during 2026, which include:

The 250th Anniversary of the Establishment of The United States of America
The 25th Anniversary of September 11th
The 75th Anniversary of St. James

THE 250TH ANNIVERSARY OF AMERICA: The year 2026 marks the 250th Anniversary of the United States. While these are tentative plans, we have been meeting to discuss monthly celebrations which will include:

January: A Holy Hour to introduce the 250th Anniversary of America

February: Youth Essay Contest of the moral and religious themes in the Declaration of Independence

March: To be determined.

April: A Special Day on the Shroud of Turin (April 11th – 9:00 to 3:00 PM).

May: Patriotic Rosary on Memorial Day (May 25th)

June: Blessing of American Flags on June 14th – Flag Day

July: American Independence (to be celebrated on July 11th) Mass of the Nations

August: Patriotic Movies (July & August, twice a month)

September: 25th Anniversary of September 11th

October: 75th Anniversary of the founding of St. James Church

November: Choir Concert with Patriotic Music in honor of Veterans Day (November 11th).

December: Holy Hour for the Conclusion of the 250th Anniversary Year.

THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF SEPTEMBER 11: Many of us have vivid memories of that day and the months that followed. My first memory is how beautiful the weather was that day. It was clear and sunny.

I arrived at Resurrection Church in Farmingville, where I was serving as their pastor at that time. I was doing some work in my office, prior to celebrating the 9:00 AM parish Mass. My secretary came into my office telling me that a “small” plane had just crashed into one the buildings of the World Trade Center, 8:46 local time. I thought those poor people! I imagined that the plane bounced off the building and fell to the ground.

After the Mass I went to my office and my secretary, obviously distraught, shared with me that a second plane crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center at 9:03 AM. We were obviously under attack. Many Americans were glued to their televisions throughout the day and for many weeks afterwards.

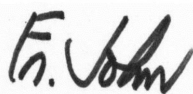
The weeks and months that followed were a time of tremendous caution. Some roads were closed, along with some bridges. Getting home for work or schools was a challenge and a nightmare.

How is it that 25 years have passed since that day? We will pay special tribute on the 25th Anniversary.

THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF ST. JAMES PARISH AND CHURCH: I remember soon after I came here that plans were being made to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of our parish, which was founded on October 11, 1951. Some of us traveled out to Sts. Peter and Paul Parish in Manorville. Their Church was originally on our property, serving as our first worship space. At the time of our 60th Anniversary there were many parishioners who were here from the beginning. It was good to hear all their stories. We committed ourselves to building on the shoulders of the founding parishioners, priests and staff.

Here we are now planning the celebration of our 75th Anniversary next October. We have come a long way continuing to build a parish of shared faith, friendship and community.

STAY TUNED: In the weeks ahead, we hope to finalize our plans for these celebrations. I hope that each of you will participate in these special occasions throughout 2026.

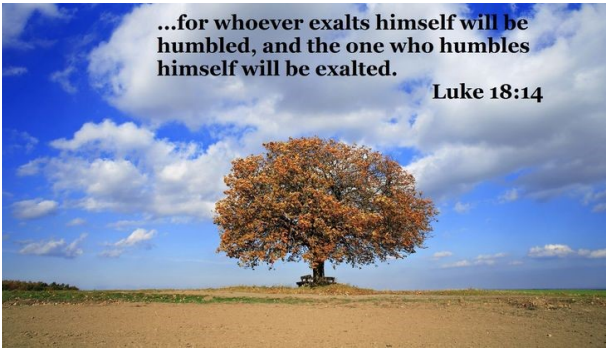

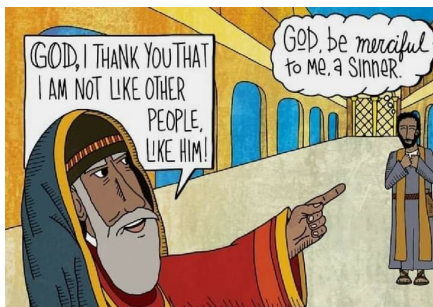

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Every now and then readers of these reflections write letters in which they object to something. Years ago, this Gospel of Luke 18 prompted such an email. A man wrote to me: "I find it deeply offensive that you suggest we are still sinners once we are God's sons and daughters." His objection stirred in me a profound awareness of the paradox at the heart of our faith. Are we sinners or beloved children of God?

In this Gospel (Luke 18:9-14), a tax collector appears as one who has missed the mark. His sins have isolated him. His breast-beating is not an act of self-flagellation for pride's sake but a heartfelt admission of his failure and unworthiness. Remarkably, Jesus honors the candid humility of the parable's penitent. Why? Because we are always in need of mercy, always. But even more, perhaps because on the cross, Jesus will fully embrace a similar place of humiliation and rejection. He will enter into the most shameful, offensive place of the sinner so that we might "go home justified."

There is a sacred tension in admitting that we are sinners and yet have profound hope. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, growing precisely through our honest acceptance of failure. When we cry, "Have mercy on us," during Mass or when we repeat the "Jesus Prayer" in quiet moments, or in the confessional, we embrace our imperfections as fertile ground for divine grace. In doing so, we follow Christ's example — finding true exaltation in the humble acknowledgment of our human frailty.

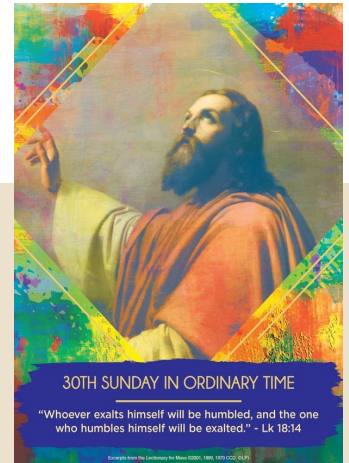

Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

Prior to volunteering in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, the Diocese requires the following:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on active volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org
When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
 - b. On the first screen, select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment as the name of your organization.
 - c. Follow all directions, provide the required information on each screen.
 - d. Please be specific about your role/title. **(Volunteer is not a role/title. List your role Coach, Catechist, Lector, EM, etc.)**
 - e. Read and Electronically acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - f. From the schedule, select the class you will attend.
 - g. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers/First Advantage is the company providing background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. **DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!** For security purposes, if you do not complete the process you will be locked out of the system.
 - c. You will be asked to provide your Social Security Number. If you do not provide a SSN you will be charged a \$95.00 fee to process your application. This fee will be collected during the application process and is payable with a credit/debit card.

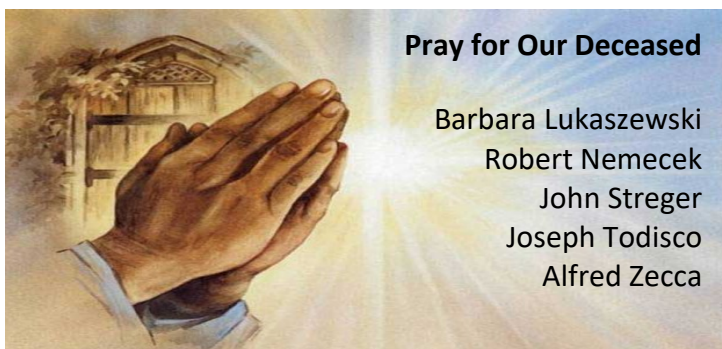

Question: Why do we kneel at Mass?

Q & A

Answer: Since the beginnings of the Church, kneeling has been a key posture of prayer. We see Sts. Peter and Paul in the Acts of the Apostles kneeling in prayer. Early in the 4th century, the Council of Nicea prohibited kneeling on Sundays and special feasts. Kneeling began more as a posture of penance for our sins, but in the history of the Church, it has become more a posture of reverence and solemn prayer. You will notice that the times we kneel at Mass are tied to the consecration of the holy Eucharist. We kneel in both anticipation of what will occur and then in awe of what has taken place: Jesus Christ becomes truly present to us under the guise of bread and wine. The profoundness of this event has over time led the Church to mandate in the current General Instruction of the Roman Missal that kneeling is the only posture allowed during this time. The sheer awesomeness of the holy Eucharist leads us to fall to our knees in wonder and thanksgiving.
