A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST,

TRIBUTE TO FR. DAN: We recently installed a plaque and canvas in the church in honor of Fr. Dan (Msgr. Dan Picciano) who served as the 6th Pastor of St. James Parish from 1988 - 2000. Fr. Dan was a well-loved pastor, who focused his attention not only on the celebration of the Sacraments, but also on building a sense of community among our parishioners.

Some of his accomplishments:

- A campaign to help finance our present church.

- The actual building of St. James

- Developed a strong sense of community among the parishioners of St. James

- Started the custom of priests being outside after every Mass to greet people

- Named "Monsignor" in 1996.

- Our Parish Carnivals

- Parish Craft Fairs

- Created the St. James Herald, a newspaper illustrating the good things happening at St. James

Some challenges:

- Closing the parish school.

- Encouraging people to attend Mass in Delaney Hall temporarily until a new church could be built.

- Orchestrating parish funerals, First Communions and Confirmations at neighboring parishes while our church was being built.

Every pastor has accomplishments and challenges during his term. A sense of good judgement, courage to do the right thing and support from parishioners and clergy assists us in both managing our accomplishments and navigating the obstacles.

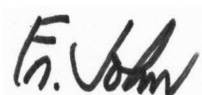
When Fr. Dan passed away on May 31, 2024, we were honored to celebrate his Mass of Christian burial here at St. James Church. There were many priests who concelebrated his funeral Mass. The large number of people who attended included parishioners from the several parishes where he served.

We recently placed a plaque in honor of Fr. Dan, which is under the canvas of the Good Shepherd hung earlier in his honor. The plaque reads,

1 Peter 5:2*

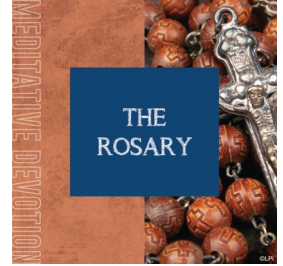

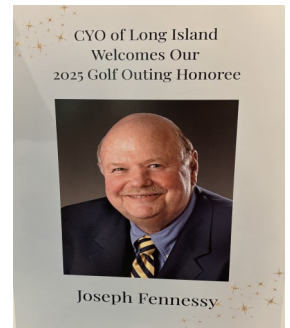

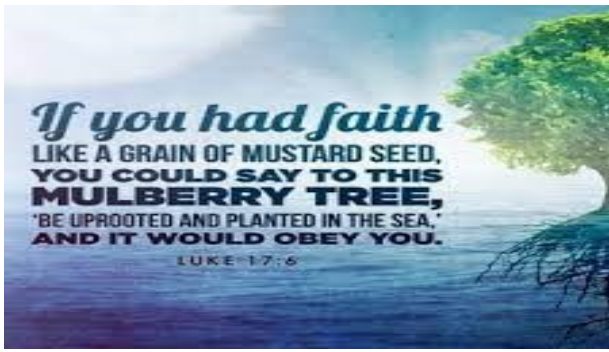

GOSPEL MEDITATION

A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months, her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, “I was just doing my job.”

His words brought to mind Jesus’ teaching this week in Luke 17:10: **“So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, ‘We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty.’”** In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation.

How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.

LIVE THE LITURGY

The Apostles beg Jesus for increased faith, but they don’t really want faith. They want a magical feeling of certainty that requires no effort. Real faith must grow and sprout roots in fertile soil. Real faith requires attention and work. Are we willing to work?

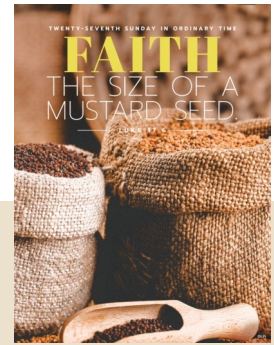

- 3 Be spiritually detached from sin
- 4 Receive Jesus truly present in the Holy Eucharist
- 5 Pray for the Holy Father and his intentions

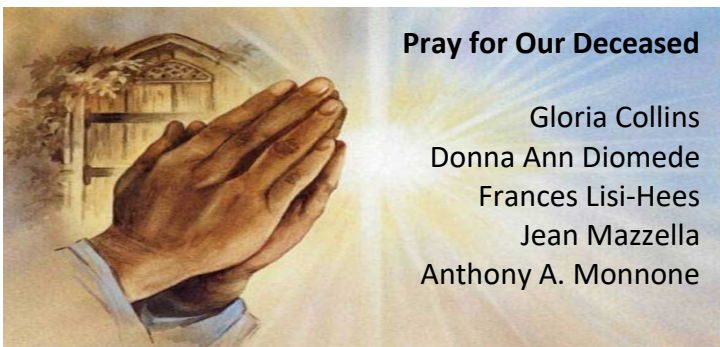

Question: Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Q & A

Answer: The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus. This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.

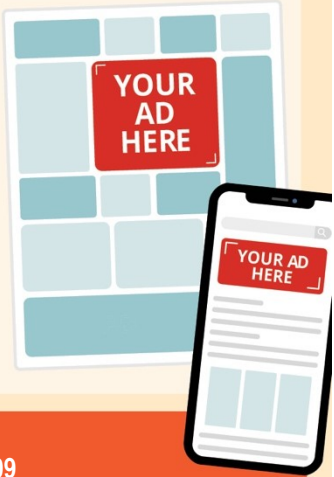
