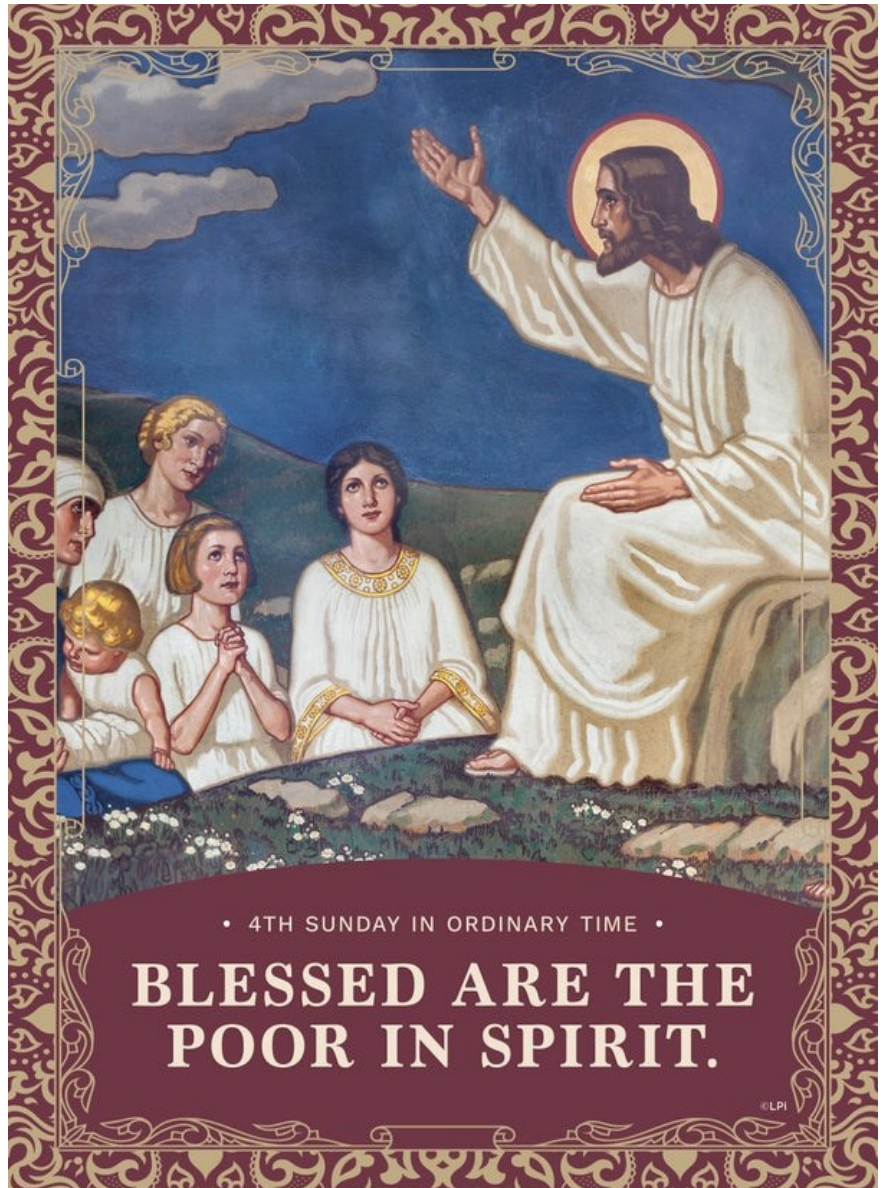
OUR MISSION

A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

“Will this be just another Lent to endure (or ignore), or will this Lent be the one that transforms your life?”

Lent is about making choices. Only you and I can decide if this is going to be “just another Lent” or if this Lent is going to be an opportunity for us to “*root out all that is not yet Christ in us*” and to become more deeply engaged in the life of the Church.

Our choice to accept the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday is an important one. The mark of ashes is our “yes” to enter the discipline of Lent through prayer, fasting, acts of charity and greater care for the poor (almsgiving). These penitential acts are meant to realign our lives so that we make a “return to the Lord” and show a greater loyalty to the Gospel.

Fr. Mark Toup, a parish priest and spiritual guide, says simply, *“If you always do what you’ve always done, you’ll always get what you’ve always got.”*

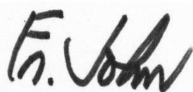
Do something different this Lent. We are offering two special spiritual programs to assist you in the work of Lent. One is the Alpha program, which gives all the participants an opportunity to grow spiritually within a safe environment, while building a stronger sense of community.

Our second offering will be a Parish Lenten Mission, each Monday during Lent, starting on Monday February 23rd, from 7:30 – 8:30 PM. These talks will be given within the context of a Holy Hour, and will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The word repent is a call to return to the Lord with all our hearts. Maybe, you and I don’t think of ourselves as having moved away from God. After all, we see ourselves as good people. Is Pope Francis a “good person?” Yet when he was interviewed by Antonio Spadaro, for America Magazine, the Pope’s simple response to say something about himself was, *“I am a sinner.”* Only when you and I believe the same about ourselves will we be able to respond to the call to repentance, the essential work of Lent. Yes, even “good people” sin and are in need of repentance.

The call to “believe in the Gospel” is not simply to accept certain truths. To believe in the Gospel is to be “loyal” to Jesus and his teachings. All of our decisions, in every aspect of our lives, must flow from what we believe. That’s how true believers behave.

So what will it be? The choice is ours to make. Don’t make this just another Lent to endure! Make this Lent a time of personal spiritual growth and transformation. Each Sunday our homilies will help guide you in this resolve. Then, after the work of Lent is done, we will be ready to renew our commitment to Christ through the renewal of our baptismal promises at Easter.

Liturgical Life

St. Blaise | February 3 -

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life. One day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived. Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

A priest I know was once falsely accused of a terrible crime. The claim was wild and easily disproved, but for a while, it didn't matter. In the atmosphere shaped by the abuse crisis of the early 2000s, the public assumption was guilty until proven innocent. His name was dragged through the mud, and his ministry placed on hold. I had the privilege — and the burden — of walking closely with him during that time.

He was angry. He was confused. He felt abandoned and deeply disoriented. The last thing on his mind was the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: **"Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me ... Rejoice and be glad" (Matthew 5:11-12).** Rejoice? He felt anything but.

And yet... something holy slowly grew in him. Not overnight, and not without pain. But as the truth came to light and his name was cleared, I watched him become more Christlike — more patient, more compassionate, more detached from human approval.

Maybe you haven't faced something so dramatic. But where do you feel judged? Misrepresented? Overlooked? Maybe someone else got the credit or the promotion. Maybe someone you love isn't getting their due. In those moments, the Cross of Jesus is near. When we feel accused, that's when we ask him for the grace not just to endure, but somehow, mysteriously, to rejoice and be glad.

LIVE THE LITURGY

Blessed are the poor, the meek, the persecuted. These are radical words in a world that insists the opposite: blessed are the wealthy. Blessed are the forceful. Blessed are the comfortable. Do we have what it takes to be radical?

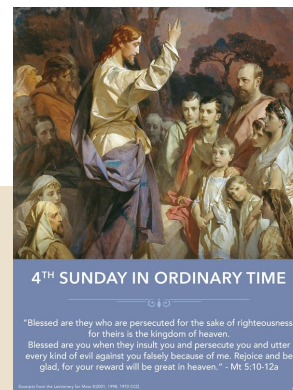

Question: Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

Q & A

Answer: A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.
