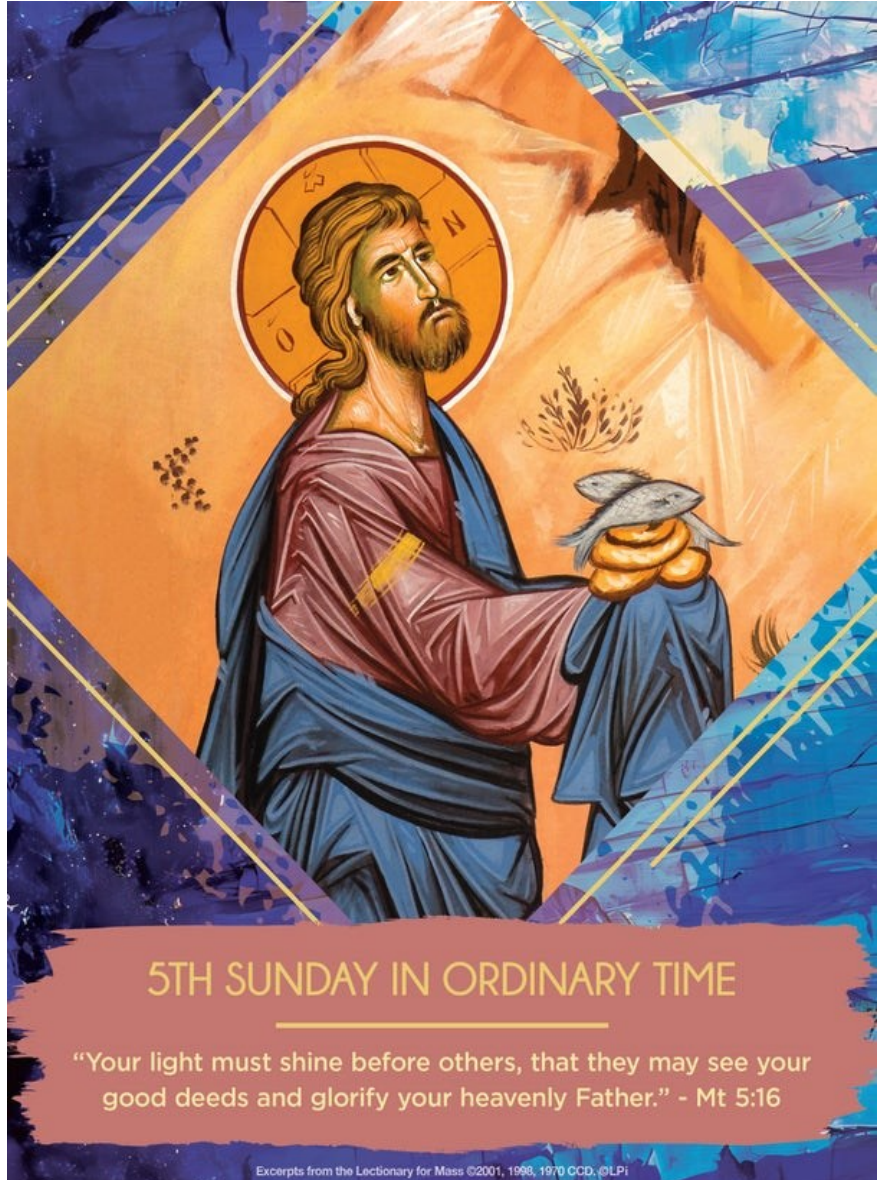
OUR MISSION

A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

MY FAVORITE LITURGICAL SEASON: I have shared with you in the past that Lent is my favorite season as it acts as a reset button in my life as a follower of Jesus.

I am busy about many things as a priest and a pastor. This includes not only the celebration of the sacraments and the regular celebration of the Mass, which is my greatest honor, but it also includes the work of the administration of the parish as well. Thankfully, I have a talented staff that assists me in this work. But I can become so busy with these responsibilities that I push private prayer to the bottom of the list of “things to do” on any given day.

My daily recitation of the rosary and praying the Liturgy of the Hours can be a struggle. While I make sure that praying the rosary is a top priority, I can become a bit sloppy about my duty to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, which is basically Morning and Evening Prayer. The Liturgy of the Hours includes the praying of Psalms, Psalm-prayers, a reading from the Scriptures, intercessory prayers and the Lord’s Prayer.

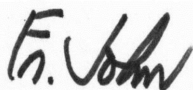
What I need to do each day is to spend time simply praying before the Blessed Sacrament. This is not using words, not asking God for anything, not “complaining” to the Lord about anything but simply sitting before the Lord quietly with the intention, *“Speak Lord for your servant is listening.”* Well, I’m working on it. Thankfully, I will have 40 days to make some progress. So, as I remind others, *“Be patient. Be more concerned about progress than completing the task at hand.”*

REPENT AND TURN AWAY FROM SIN: I have been hearing confessions for almost 45 years. For me it is a moment of grace as I am called to act in the place of Jesus as each person comes to celebrate this most important Sacrament of God’s Mercy, Forgiveness and Reconciliation.

Celebrating this Sacrament with people has been a special moment of grace, not only for the person going to confession but to us priests who are given this very special ministry, acting in the name of Jesus.

GOING TO CONFESSION IS JUST THE START: It is important that we do an appropriate “examination of conscious” before going to confession. But the confession of our sins is just the start. Ask yourself, *“Are you committed to turning away from the sin(s) that you might regularly be committing?”* I will address this in my pastor’s letter next weekend.

Let’s pray for each other as we enter the Season of Lent!

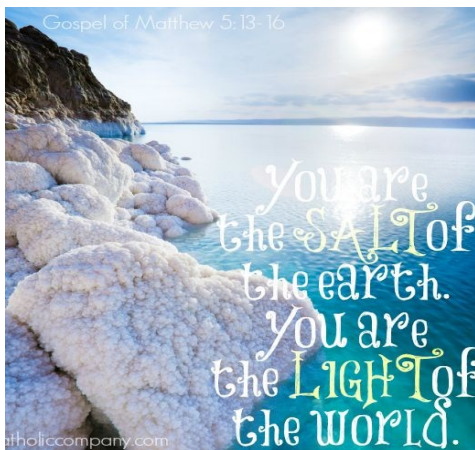

GOSPEL MEDITATION

I recently learned why zebras have stripes. Scientists used to think it was for camouflage, but new research suggests something more interesting: the stripes help zebras blend in with one another. When a predator looks at a herd, the overlapping stripes make it hard to single out one animal. But if a researcher spray-paints a dot on just one zebra, predators lock on it and eventually attack. The lesson? In the wild, blending in is protection. Standing out can be dangerous.

Human beings are not so different. Most of us would rather blend in than stand out, especially when it comes to our faith. We know that giving bold witness to Jesus — through our words, values, or public choices — can make us targets for criticism, isolation, or judgment. That's why Jesus' words in today's Gospel are so challenging: **"You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden" (Matthew 5:14).**

A city on a hill draws attention. It also draws fire. But that's part of the cost of discipleship. Jesus doesn't call us to be tribal or boastful. He calls us to stand in the open with humble confidence, so that people might see our good deeds and glorify our Father in heaven. Today, let's ask for the courage not just to believe in Christ, but to be seen believing in him.

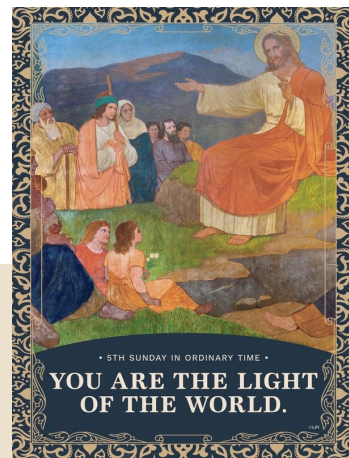

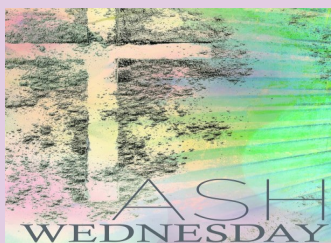

Question: Are near-death experiences real?

Q & A

Answer: There is a lot of curiosity and fascination with the idea of an afterlife and communicating with those who have died. In movies, television shows, and numerous books, people make claims about their ability to communicate with the dead, or having had a near-death experience. There is no objective way to verify any of this. While details about people and events can be surprisingly accurate, it is just circumstantial evidence that might be explained in other ways. On the other hand, when people have unusual experiences, sometimes called near-death or out-of-body, it is real to them. They react with the emotions and thoughts that one would expect. At times, they report details they could not have known any other way, such as bits of conversation, or meeting people they had never known in this life. So certainly, to the person, they experience something. We believe in a life after death, we believe in the communion of saints. These things are not a contradiction to faith, but we should not base our faith on them, nor change our beliefs. They are unexplained and will likely remain so.

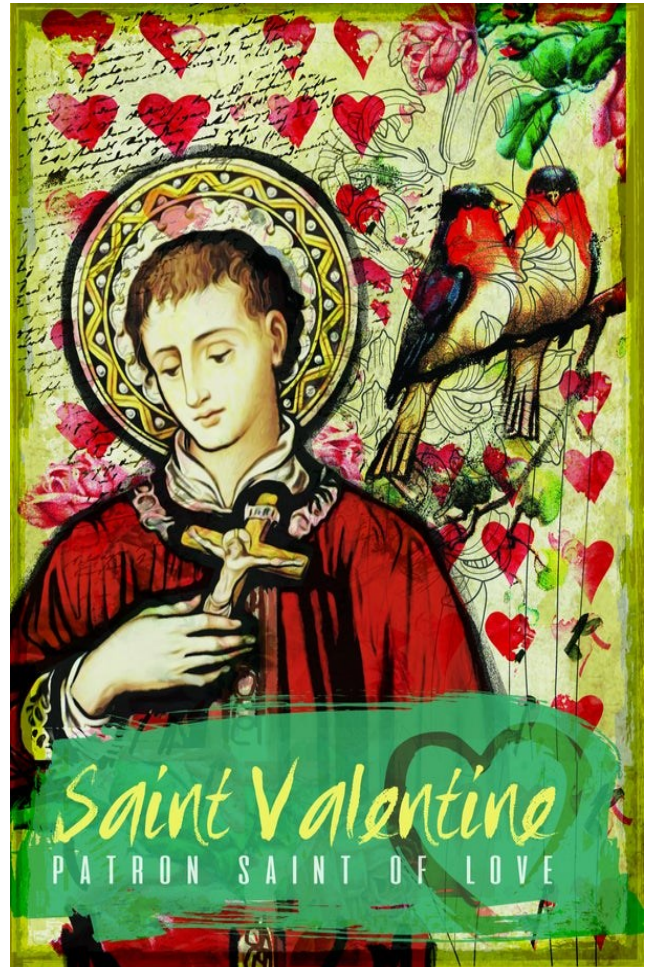
