A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

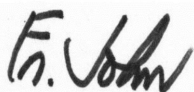
SNOW REMOVAL: This winter has been challenging not only with the many very cold days but also due to the cost of the snow removal for the first two snowstorms that occurred this winter. Of course, the first storm in December dumped a foot of snow over a several hour period. It took quite a while to plow and shovel. Keep in mind that we are responsible not only for our property clear but to keep the sidewalks around the perimeter of our property cleared of snow as well. The cost of snow removal so far this winter has come to over \$34,000 (this amount does not include the storm from last weekend – we are waiting for the invoice). This amount is more than 3 entire weeks of Sunday collections and will probably end up costing closer to 5 or 6 weekend collections.

SPECIAL SNOW REMOVAL COLLECTION: Next weekend, March 7th and 8th, we will be having a special **SECOND COLLECTION** to help defray the costs of these snowstorms. I am thanking you in advance for your generous contributions to this collection. Recall, that these snowstorms; especially the first, meant that much fewer people attended Mass. As a result, our Sunday collections were affected, bringing our regular collections those weekends much lower than normal. The special collection we will be holding at all the Masses next weekend is to address this need as well.

SNOW REMOVAL ACCOUNT: A special snow removal account has been set up on “WeShare” for anyone who would like to make your contribution online. The WeShare giving portal can be found on our parish website. Of course, contributions to any additional storms can be made on the “WeShare” portal as well. *“Parish Members are encouraged to set up an account and manage their contributions. You have complete control over contribution amount and frequency of payments. . .”*

IS THERE ANY CONNECTION BETWEEN OUR CONTRIBUTIONS TO SNOW REMOVAL AND OUR LENTEN PRACTICES? In fact, there is. Part of Lent is almsgiving and providing financial support of the Church. The financial support that you contribute to St. James Church each week helps to defray the cost of salaries, including the salaries of our parish priests, benefits, office supplies, and utilities. You see, in a regular way your contributions to St. James are necessary to meet the normal expenses of running our parish.

SUNDAY COLLECTIONS: Please realize that your financial support of St. James Church is what allows us to pay our bills. So, when the collection basket comes your way realize that the money that you are placing in the basket permits us to meet our expenses. That’s why we all need to be as generous as we can when we place our offerings on the collection basket. I want to extend to you my sincerest gratitude for your regular generosity to St. James.

What's happening in Faith Formation? Sunday, March 1, 2026 Second Sunday in Lent

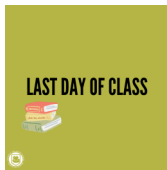

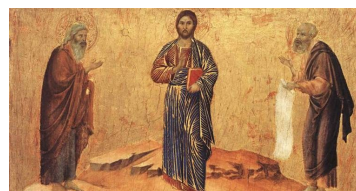

GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I sit down to answer emails or write a Gospel reflection or return a phone call, I sometimes wonder: Does any of this humdrum work matter? Maybe you ask the same thing about your daily labor. Today's Gospel, the Transfiguration, offers a surprising answer.

Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a mountain. There, **"his face shone like the sun face and his clothes become white as light"** (Matthew 17:2). That detail regarding his clothes is worth considering.

We know Jesus' body is inseparably united to the divine nature. But his clothing? That's something made by human hands. It's an artifact. And yet it shines with the same uncreated light. What does this detail mean? The early Church noted that Adam and Eve's first act after the Fall was to make clothing. This clothing symbolizes all human labor that supports our dignity. In Jesus' glorified garments, we see not just the redemption of our body, but of human effort to protect and uplift human dignity.

Parents, your family is your work. Baristas, plumbers, nurses, accountants — your labor, your emails, your phone calls, your spreadsheets — can all become radiant when offered to God in love. The question isn't just do I believe in Jesus' glory, but do I believe he can share it with the work of my hands?

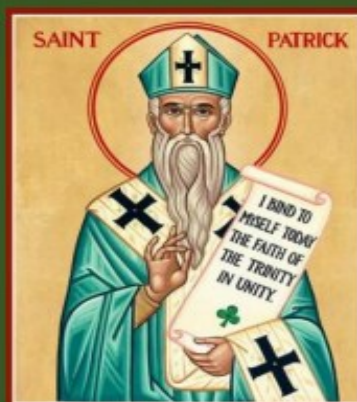
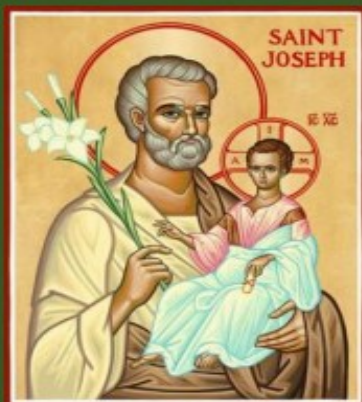

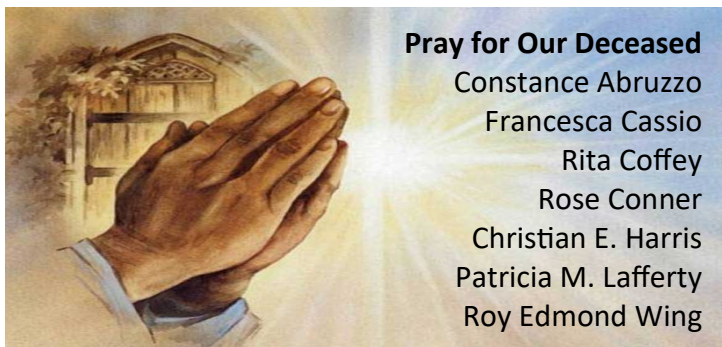

Question: What is the Christian attitude towards violent conflicts?

Q & A

Answer: In the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches us "Blessed are the peacemakers" and to "love your enemies." All human beings are made in God's image and likeness. We are one human family — brothers and sisters despite what divides us. Christians have the obligation to prioritize peaceful means to resolve conflicts. War wreaks a toll on a nation. Civilians bear a disproportionate burden of this cost during the war itself and as the nation rebuilds. However, those in authority have the obligation to protect the innocent. During the gradual fall of the Roman Empire, theologians began to theorize that war could be just if it was a defensive measure of last resort. The "Just War Theory" was later expanded by St. Thomas Aquinas, who also included moral obligations during the war itself, including the protection of civilians. Those in public authority have the obligation to carefully examine their motives, agendas, and rationale for violent force. Should a cause be just, those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be valued and honored. They deserve our support both during and after the war.
