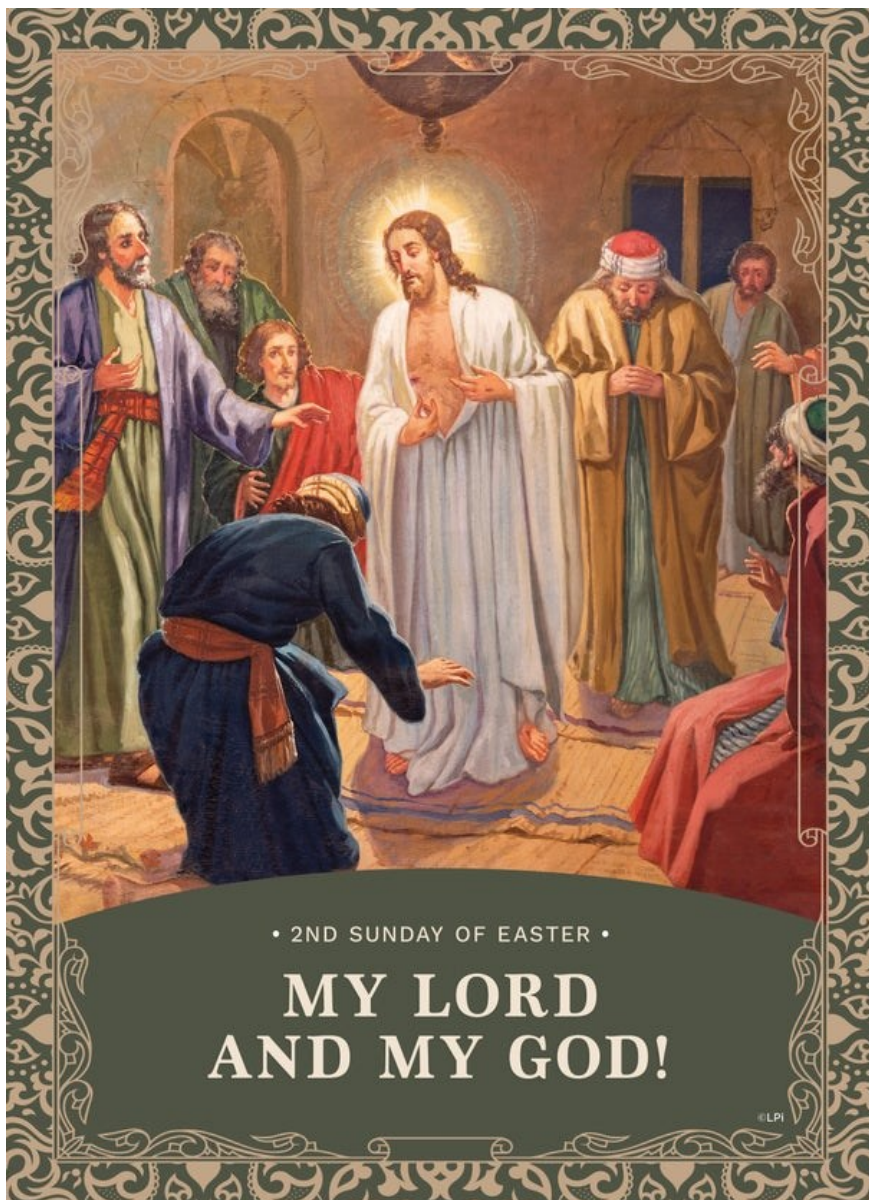
OUR MISSION

A Note from the Pastor

DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST:

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: This weekend we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. According to the USCCB, "Divine Mercy Sunday originated from private revelations received by St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun, in the 1930s. Jesus requested a feast dedicated to His mercy on the Sunday after Easter. Pope John Paul II established the feast for the universal Church on April 30, 2000, coinciding with St. Faustina's canonization."

Key Origins and Development

- **Revelations to St. Faustina (1930s):** According to her *Diary*, St. Faustina recorded 14 occasions where Jesus requested this feast, stating: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners".

Significance of the Date:

- The feast is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter (the Sunday after Easter), highlighting the connection between Christ's resurrection and the message of mercy.
- **The Image:** The celebration is linked to the Divine Mercy image—revealed to St. Faustina in 1931—which shows rays of blood and water flowing from Christ's heart, representing mercy.
- **Official Establishment (2000):** Pope John Paul II formally designated the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday on May 5, 2000, fulfilling the request recorded in the diary.



Purpose and Traditions

- **Divine Mercy Sunday** is intended to be a day of extraordinary graces, where the faithful can receive forgiveness for sins.
- **Devotions** include celebrating Mass, receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), and praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
- **The Novena** begins on Good Friday, leading up to the feast, as requested by Jesus.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday let us remind ourselves that Jesus requested that this special feast be established. As we celebrate this feast let us present ourselves and others to the Divine Mercy of Jesus so that we will participate in this great gift of mercy that he extends to us.

What is Alpha?



Alpha is a multi-week course that creates a space where people come and discuss life's big questions. Each talk looks at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation. Alpha runs online, in cafés, churches, universities, homes - you name it. No two Alphas look the same, but generally they have three key things in common: hospitality, a talk and good conversation.

What does an Alpha session consist of?

First, there's food

Whether it's a group of friends gathered around a kitchen table, or a quick catch up over coffee and cake, food has a way of bringing people together. It's no different at Alpha. Most sessions start with food, because it's a great way to build community and get to know each other.

Then there's a talk

The talks are designed to engage and inspire conversation. Usually around thirty minutes long, they may be a live talk or played as a video. They explore the big issues around faith and unpack the basics of Christianity, addressing questions from Who is Jesus? and How can we have faith? to Why and how do I pray? and How does God guide us?

Finally, a discussion

This is probably the most important part of any Alpha: the chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, and simply discuss it in a small group. There's no obligation to say anything and there's nothing you can't say (seriously). It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest, friendly and open environment.

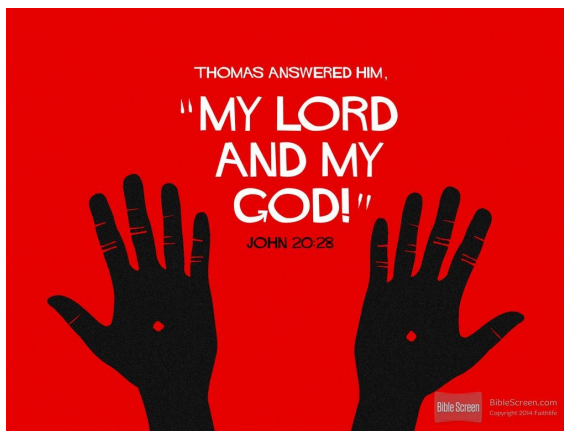

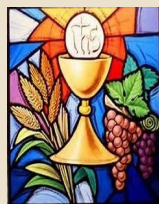

GOSPEL MEDITATION

"Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.'" (John 20:27)
In my early 20s, I volunteered at a parish youth group. I witnessed teens encountering Jesus with a fresh, romantic wonder that reminded me of my own teenage conversion. But something had changed in me. I was quietly jaded and cynical. When teens shared stories of encountering Christ, I'd want to sarcastically murmur, "Well, good for you." I had grown suspicious of the zeal I once knew.

Then we brought the group on a pilgrimage. I was standing in an old church in France, ignoring a long-winded tour guide. I found myself before a crucifix. In that moment, I heard something, not audibly, but unmistakably in my heart: "I came to be your friend... and you wish to be my enemy? Why do you stand far from me? I suffer gladly for you. I was pierced for you. Why do you run from me?" My heart opened. I saw how cold and cynical I had become. But Jesus had not given up on me. He had returned, and his mercy broke through.

So I can relate to the scoffing — and transformation — of Thomas when the Risen Jesus presents his wounds for inspection. Thomas is not simply doubting; he is guarded, suspicious, even cynical. But Jesus comes to him. No lecture. Just understanding and mercy. He invites Thomas to touch his wounds. This burns away his cynicism like the morning mist.

Divine Mercy Challenge: This week, rejoice with someone who is newly alive in faith. If your own heart has grown skeptical or tired, ask Jesus to help you. He will.

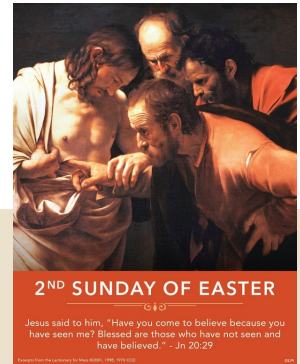

Liturgical Minister Training– Spring 2026

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance, with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

Dates and Locations for Liturgical Minister Training

- **Lector Workshop and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion – Part A:**
Tuesday, April 21 – St. Elizabeth/Melville – Msgr. Kane Hall; 7 pm – 10 pm

You may ask your pastor to register you for EITHER the Lector Workshop OR Extraordinary Minister training at these sessions.

- **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion – Part A:**
Saturday, May 30 – Immaculate Conception/Westhampton Beach – Parish Center; 9:00 am – 12 noon. There is NO Lector Workshop offered at this session.

You may only be registered with your Pastor's nomination. Doors open 30 minutes before the training start time. End time is an estimate, session may end prior to 10 pm, please be prepared.

- **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion Part B** – presented in conjunction with Catholic Health.

These sessions will run from 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm. Doors open at 6:30 pm.

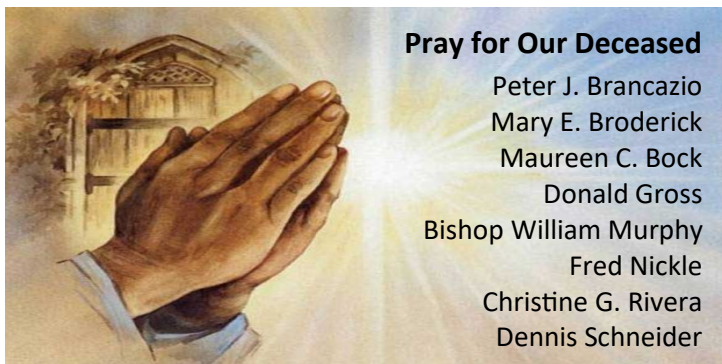

Question: Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Q & A

Answer: If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world. Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come."
